The Neighborhood Committee proposes that the VNC Board recommend to Mayor Eric Garcetti and the Los Angeles City Council that: Whereas The U.S. Department of Human Health & Services has listed polystyrene as a 'reasonably anticipated human carcinogen" and: Whereas polystyrene #6 packaging is pervasive in the environment, extremely damaging throughout its lifecycle, and difficult to recycle and: Whereas food-service polystyrene greatly contributes to litter and constitutes the second most abundant form of beach debris littering California beaches therefore: the Neighborhood Council supports a city-wide phaseout of Polystyrene #6 foam and rigid/oriented food containers, utensils, straws and lids, because of both the human health and environmental threat associated with these products.
