**MOTION:** The Venice Neighborhood Council supports and encourages Los Angeles City Council Members Tom LaBonge and Paul Krekorian in their motion, dated November 1, 2013, to instruct the Department of Planning, with the assistance of the City Attorney, to evaluate the Small Lot Subdivision Ordinance and prepare any changes to the Ordinance that are necessary to ensure Small Lot Subdivisions are compatible with the neighborhood in which they are constructed.

**MOTION:** Whereas, many Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) schools are need of repair injcluding broken air-conditioning and heating systems, cracked cement, leaking ceilings; in

Whereas, Los Angeles voters approved a bond measure to fund school repair and construction; Whereas, the Citizens Bond Oversight Committee recommended denial of the iPad purchase beyond the first phase;

Whereas, the long term negative effects of the misuse of construction bond funds include a skeptical public refusing to pass critical future bond measures;

Whereas, there is a great need to support technology to Title I students who are disproportionately without wi-fi service at home and would therefore not be able to use the iPads away from school; Whereas the selection process was flawed. The iPad that was selected was bundled with software which the selection panel has not been allowed to see or evaluate, the software cannot contain text books;

Whereas, local schools need flexibility to recommend specific technology solutions to support local programs and curricula, and teachers, principals and parents on various local leadership councils can best make recommendations for individual schools rather than a one-size-fits-all solution;

Whereas, the Common Core Technology Project commits untold future expenditures from the general fund that cannot legally be covered by construction bonds;

Whereas, LAUSD superintendent Deasy has not explained to the public what further cuts will be made to pay for the iPad program after the school repair and construction bond is depleted; Whereas, the exorbitant cost of the iPads does not reflect the priorities of parents, teachers and administrators while LAUSD class sizes are unreasonably high and important programs such as early education, arts education, PE and adult education have been cut close to elimination; Whereas, LAUSD officials state that the school district is deeply in debt;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Venice Neighborhood Council respectfully requests that the LAUSD

**MOTION:** The Venice Neighborhood Council recommends approval of the project ONLY with the following conditions:

1) Hours of Operation: Outdoor dining area shall close at 10PM Sunday thru Thursday and 11 PM Friday and Saturday. Indoor Dining shall close midnight daily.

2) Employee Parking: Free off-street parking shall be provided to employees who drive while they are on shift –either on site or a designated offsite location

3) Incentive Program: Applicant shall create an incentive program for employees who walk, bike or take transit to work.

4) Plan approval: is required in 5 years.

5) All deliveries shall be made in the rear parking area, no loading or unloading of deliveries shall be permitted along Abbot Kinney Blvd, Electric Avenue, Westminster Street and Broadway Avenue.

6) Any activities associated with areas devoted to trash compacting, loading and unloading,

receiving, and the "tote and bale" enclosure, shall be limited as follows: Monday through Friday, 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM; Saturday, 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM; except as follows: There should be no deliveries 45 minutes prior to Westminster school commencing and 15 minutes after school commencement time and no deliveries 1 hour after Westminster school ends. Delivery and trash pickup times should be limited based upon peak traffic hours and Westminster school hours. No deliveries, receiving, trash, or storage area use shall be allowed on Sunday or legal holidays.

7) That passenger loading shall be limited to the existing passenger loading spaces along Abbot Kinney Blvd. which shall be used by the valet. No other street parking shall be used by the valet at any time.

8) No amplified music shall be permitted in the outdoor dining patio - acoustical music only

- 9) Valet Parking: Valet parking shall be provided free of charge with 90 minute validation
- 10) One valet operator shall be responsible on site that will be accountable for enforcement.
- a) Required parking shall be available during all hours of operation of the restaurant.



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b) All restaurants, employees that drive to work shall park on site and free of charge during their employment shift hours.

c) All restaurant patrons shall receive a free 90 minute parking validation.
