Whereas Miracle Messages and Safe Place for Youth have already offered their services for such a program,

Therefore Be It Resolved that the VNC supports this program to be held in Venice during the second week of December 2016 to coincide with the holiday season and encourages other local organizations to participate as well. Recommended by Homeless Committee 5-0-0
