-Whereas the Venice Homeless Committee seeks to streamline and publish contact information for area service providers, local non-profits and government agencies that provide assistance to both the housed and unhoused of Venice.

-Whereas the Venice Homeless Committee seeks to distribute this contact information in both printed form through mailed brochures and/or door hangers to home owners, pass out cards to homeless, and also posted on the VNC Website.

-Therefore we ask the VNC to fund the printing and distribution of the information stated above.

b. Bathroom Access at Night – Motion





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-Whereas there are no public bathroom access hours at nighttime resulting in unsanitary conditions on the streets.

-Whereas the public sanitation and safety concerns are at an all high due to spreading viruses and bacteria.

-Therefore we ask the VNC to recommend to the City of LA and the County of LA that access to the beach bathrooms be available until midnight and that the LA City provide either permanent or mobile showers for the homeless.
