Every person wishing to address the Board must dial telephone number listed above, and enter the above Meeting Id number and then press # to join the meeting. When prompted by the presiding officer, to provide public input at the Neighborhood Council meeting the public will be requested to dial *9 or use the Raise Hand option, to address the Board on any agenda item before the Board takes an action on an item. Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered. Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting. Public comment is limited to 30 seconds per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

22 Boundary Adjustment along VNC and DRNC border

Description:

There is a portion of land that lies along east of Lincoln Blvd and is within the Venice Neighborhood council overlay. Del Rey Neighborhood Council has requested that we adjust the boundaries so this area lies within the Del Rey Neighborhood Council District.

NOTE: When viewing the Map Attachment, the dotted line that is defined as a Dash Dot Dash on the map shows the existing boundary prior to adjustment abutting the VNC and DRNC council regions. If motion is adopted this line will be moved to the center line of Lincoln Blvd starting at Washington Blvd and continue southward to the tip of the Venice NC, Oxford Triangle southern most boundary.

Description of adjusted Venice Boundary to mirror proposed Del Rey NC region:

Exact language TBD

The following describes the proposed Del Rey NC region.

Beginning at the centerline of Lincoln Blvd southeast along the centerline of Washington Boulevard, then at the southwesterly prolongation of the southeasterly boundary of the City of Culver City, continuing southeasterly of Washington Boulevard. Said boundary being established April 11, 1927 by ORD 56497. Thence northeasterly along said irregular jogging boundary line to the southwesterly boundary line of Culver City, southwest of Sawtelle Boulevard. Thence southeasterly along said irregular and jogging City boundary line to an irregular City boundary line, established August 28, 1952 under CF 53079,

southeasterly to the centerline projection of Emporia Avenue, thence southwesterly along the southeasterly line of Tract 16954 to the northeast property line of Mesmer Avenue, hence southeasterly along said City boundary to the northwesterly property line of Jefferson Boulevard; thence northeasterly along said City boundary to the southwesterly property line of Bankfield Avenue to a southwesterly jog in the boundary of Culver City; thence southwesterly along this City boundary line to the centerline of Centinela Avenue; hence westerly along said centerline in an arc concave southerly to its centerline intersection with Jefferson Boulevard. Thence southwesterly along the centerline of Jefferson Boulevard and Bay Street (vacated), thence northwesterly along the centerline of Bay Street to the center of the Los Angeles County storm drain easement known as Ballona Creek; thence southwesterly along the center of the creek to the centerline of Lincoln Blvd.; thence northwesterly along the centerline of Lincoln Boulevard to the corner of Washington Blvd.

24 CIS Increase Mental Health Beds and Related Staffing CF 21-0002-S195

Description:

Stakeholder: Mark Ryavec Dated: 2021-12-13

The concept of the Resolution below originated as a Motion in the Homeless Committee of the Westside Regional Alliance of Councils (WRAC), proposed by members Dr. Renee Sabshin and Mark Ryavec. The earlier Motion was passed by the VNC and by 2/3rds of the NCs and CCs of WRAC. RESOLUTION WHEREAS, any official position of the City of Los Angeles with respect to legislation, rules, regulations or policies proposed to or pending before a local, state or federal governmental body or agency must have first been adopted in the form of a Resolution by the City Council with the concurrence of the Mayor; and WHEREAS, a recent study by the California Policy Lab found that one in five

unhoused people engaged by outreach workers in Los Angeles County - about 7,000 - had a diagnosis of serious mental illness; and WHEREAS, studies estimate that almost 40 percent of the County jail population - about 5,000 inmates on a typical day - are in need of mental health treatment; and WHEREAS, people experiencing homelessness in Los Angeles are living on the streets with severe mental illness and are unable to avail themselves of public services, and as a result are dying in the streets; and WHEREAS, it is estimated that there are only 1,700 sub-acute beds in the County where patients can live for a few days or a few months with psychiatric care provided; and WHEREAS, this number of sub-acute beds is about a third of the number needed; and WHEREAS, clinicians are reluctant to prescribe 72-hour or longer psychiatric holds or conservatorships under the State's Lanterman-Petrus-Short Act due to this shortfall in facilities, as well as a shortage of skilled staff; and WHEREAS, it estimated that the State of California will have a S31 billion surplus in the next fiscal year; NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, with concurrence of the Mayor, that the City Council, by the adoption of this Resolution, hereby includes in its 2021-22 State Legislative Program, SPONSORSHIP and/or SUPPORT of legislation or administrative action for the State to allocate funding to allow Los Angeles County to meet the number of beds recommended by mental health experts: 50 public beds per 100,000 residents.
