Neighborhood Purposes Grants


Purpose and intent of the grant.

This grant has two parts: Part One is to work with the City of Los Angeles to do a pilot project which will identify native tree species to plant in empty parkways. Part Two is to work with Recreation and Parks to replace missing trees at Oakwood Park, Venice.

Part One - Small Parkway Pilot Project

It is increasingly clear that an effective way to offset the impacts of climate change and reduce the heat island effect in cities, is to plant trees.


Trees in cities can remove up to a quarter of the particulate matter pollution in their immediate vicinity. And when planted between a source of pollution and an apartment building, school or hospital, urban trees can help protect human health.




Trees shade building, reduce heat-island effect, absorb pollutants, improve health, and reduce storm water run-off.

Citywide almost 25% of our possible tree locations are vacant. Of those nearly 200,000 are substandard in size making it difficult to find tree species that will provide the eco-services required without infrastructure disruptions. Venice has 1228 possible tree locations or vacant tree sites. The City has typically used a very limited number of tree species in these narrow parkways.

Streets Species Breakdown Chart




Breakdown of vacant tree site locations city-wide. Source: LA City UFD - Tree-Inventory.



BY THE NUMBERS

City street trees play a vital role in Venice communities. These trees mitigate the negative effects of urbanization and development, and enhance the quality of life within the community. Considering Venice's 8,845 trees, 154 stumps, and 1,228 vacant sites, the stocking rate is 86.3%. The most abundant type of tree in the inventory is broadleaf (57%) which provide the most shade.



Our pilot study will explore the use of new tree species that are locally available but not necessarily typical in the nursery setting due to their very local distribution, i.e. trees that are native to the region. However, there are over 80 species of native trees that have the potential as street trees. Of these 80 trees local experts have identified dozens that have potential in narrow parkways. Working with the Community Forest Advisory Committee, Audubon, Neighborhood Council Sustainability Alliance, TreePeople, City of LA Sanitation and Environment, and Urban Forestry, we have designed a pilot study in three neighborhoods of Los Angeles to test the suitability of these trees. Working with local volunteers, Verdant Venice Group will locate, purchase and plant trees at Padua Place and Indiana Avenue. We will water, stake, and maintain the trees for at least 5 years. To support the City's efforts to identify alternative species, VVG will monitor and record our findings to help better understand the viability of each species as a realistic replacement tree. The three pilot study areas vary due to local temperatures, coastal influence and native soils. Tree selection will consider all these factors. We hope our project will spawn an interest in commercial nursery growing of our native trees.




Verdant Venice Group Proposed Pilot Locations - Padua Place and Indiana Court

Why Plant California Natives? A. More than ninety percent of our native insects can only co-exist with native plant species. B. Native plants are ideally suited to our area as they have evolved here over centuries to the local climate, rainfall, and geography. C. The Los Angeles region has lost more than ninety percent of our local butterflies, songbirds, and other pollinators since 1900 as we have replaced our native ecosystem with almost exclusively non-native landscaping plants and trees. We are now at risk of losing up to 50% of all land-based species in this century. Urban Forestry currently only has 2.5 % native trees in our public right-of-way.

Part Two - Oakwood Park Tree Replacement

Over the course of the last 20 years, the trees in this historic and once red-lined neighborhood, have been aging out. Due to budget cuts and constraints, these trees have unfortunately not been replaced. VVG, working with local volunteers, will plant eight replacement trees at Oakwood Park. Six will be located near the picnic tables and two on the Southside of the Rec center to provide shade.

How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at-large.

In addition to their beauty, trees have been shown to provide a wide variety of important benefits such as shade in a warming climate and air purification which is especially necessary under the flight path of the SM airport. Young people in underserved communities are especially susceptible to lung damage from air pollution. Tree canopy has also been shown to lead to a decrease in crime, improved learning and mental health in school children. Trees provide habitat for butterflies and local and migrating birds. Additionally, the knowledge gained from our pilot project will help inform the City and our community about our unique native trees and will create a market for these trees so that procurement and initial care is not so time intensive. This project also has a strong educational benefit for adults and school children alike...learning about the environment, trees, pollinators, etc creates citizens who are more appreciative and involved in their communities. Beneficiaries are neighbors and businesses interests, low-income apartment dwellers, local school children, and public agencies who lack funds for plant replacement or maintenance.

Community Support


The project will build community by involving volunteers of all ages in the beautification and appreciation of our neighborhood and by inspiring people with the beauty, necessity, and understanding of our natural world and the importance of our local natural resources. Neighbors go out of their way to thank us for planting and caring for the trees that we plant and many have chosen to join us in our efforts. We will promote the idea that protecting our watershed is both an individual and collective responsibility.

The project is a good investment since it builds on an already existing structure to improve highly trafficked streets that are deteriorating, and creates on-going education to ensure continual tree care with almost no cost to the City. The project builds community by involving volunteers of all ages in the beautification and appreciation of the community.


Our project includes four of the NPG funding guidelines specifications: Beautification, Community Support, Education, and Community Improvements. It also covers all of the NPG-funded projects and activities guidelines since it is for public benefit and purpose, open, accessible, and free of charge to stakeholders.

About Verdant Venice Group


Our group has been planting trees in and around Venice low-income projects for five years. To date we have planted 519 trees (422 in Venice), many in collaboration with City-funded groups such as City Plants and LA Conservation Corps. However, programs which pay for trees are no longer available to our community because, on average, our neighborhood, in spite of our low-income housing and its history, is no longer considered a Disadvantaged Community. Therefore, we are asking for the funds to purchase these trees. There will be over dozens of stakeholders working directly on this project. Our volunteer group and other friends and neighbors will donate their time toward the labor of planting and caring for these trees for up to a minimum of five years. Our volunteers have already secured permission from the City and Parks and Recreation to plant the trees. Permitted tree locations include Oakwood Park, Padua Ave, and Indiana Ave.
