Why We Do a Census?

It's in the Constitution

- The U.S. Constitution requires a census every 10 years. The census covers the entire country and everyone living here. The first census was in 1790.
- Article 1, Section 2 of the U.S. Constitution
The actual enumeration shall be made within three years after the first meeting of the Congress of the United States, and within every subsequent term of ten years, in such manner as they shall by law direct.

Why We Do a Census?

Power

- Congressional representation
- Reapportionment & redistricting

Money

- \$675 billion distributed annually
- Funding distributed based on population

*The Internet Self Response (ISR) will be a web based application that can be used across multiple platforms. As long as you can access the internet, you will be able to utilize the ISR component. The ISR will also be ADA and 508 compliant.

Your data are confidential

- The Census is Confidential and required by Law
- Results of the Census are reported in Statistical format only
- We do not share a respondents personal information with other government agencies
- All Census Employees swear to a lifetime oath to protect respondent information
- Penalties for wrongful disclosure - Up to 5 years imprisonment and or a fine of \$250,000
