10C Postponement of Atkins Housing Package (WRAC motion)

WRAC is an alliance of Community and Neighborhood Councils which span the entire west side of the City of Los Angeles. Our regional concerns are brought up for discussion by our board members and our board is comprised of Community and Neighborhood Council leaders appointed to our board. Our positions are adopted only after a super-majority of member councils has affirmed the position in question.

WRAC holds to the following foundational principles in the areas that we have determined to be our alliance priorities: land use and zoning, housing and homelessness, mobility and transportation, public safety, education and environment. We hold that the LA Department of City Planning and its Planning & Zoning Department adhere strictly to existing planning and zoning codes and ordinances. We urge that regulations be upheld and that communities impacted by land use and development projects be allowed ample time to review and comment on any matter seeking discretionary action that is up for review. We always urge all governing agencies with jurisdiction over the approval, execution or enforcement of projects to scrupulously apply applicable codes and standards to all projects.

Similarly on housing and homelessness, WRAC urges governing bodies to adhere to strict scrutiny of community plans, local character, zoning and building regulations as well as building and safety codes and zoning restrictions. We expect agencies and entities to conduct meaningful outreach to the communities represented at WRAC, through our member councils, and address housing and homelessness relief in a responsible way that is mindful of existing communities as well as the need for increased housing density.

With respect to mobility and transportation, WRAC is acutely aware of the need for new and creative solutions to gridlock and Westside mobility, as well as mass transportation. We expect research results on transit and mobility to be made available to communities impacted by pending infrastructure or mobility planning. We urge sufficient notification to all affected parties to allow them to comment on any proposed





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developments or transportation infrastructure proposals in areas that impact our member councils. Strict scrutiny of existing laws, regulations, ordinances and standards for infrastructure development and construction, particularly in hillside and coastal areas which disproportionately impact the Westside, be applied to transportation and the development of citywide or neighborhood mobility plans and infrastructure.

We exist to empower stakeholders, and encourage and support more transparency in City governance.

Motion of Support of Land Use Statement:

Whereas, the statewide COVID-19 emergency, or any other emergency, reduces the action calendar time frame of the California State Legislature, and thus greatly reduces the ability of California's citizens and communities to demand greater accountability, fairness, transparency, and responsiveness from public officials in the area of land use planning;

Whereas the proposed "Atkins Housing Package" of bills has not been sufficiently vetted for integration with previously approved Regional Housing Needs Assessment legislation which modernized the methodology for anticipating growth in the State;

Whereas the proposed "Atkins Housing Package" of bills has not been sufficiently vetted for growth inducing impacts and hidden substantial state mandated costs upon: These bills include SB 902, SB 995, SB 1085, SB 1120, and SB 1385

i. Local General Plans and Community Plans

ii. Communities in environmentally sensitive areas such as Very High Fire Hazard zones, Coastal zones, Earthquake Fault Zones and others as listed in the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

- iii. Critical local infrastructures for the public health, welfare and safety, and
- iv. the impact upon under served communities and the affect of displacement upon them.

WHEREAS, the Venice Neighborhood Council recommends a postponement of action on this suite of housing bills until such time as the previously enacted 2018 and 2019 housing legislation has been given a chance to increase housing production as promised.

12B Sidewalks To Be Cleared if Found to be in Violation of Americans With Disabilities Act (Frank Murphy, Charles Rials on behalf of the Homeless Committee

MOTION: The Venice Neighborhood Council calls upon the City Attorney, the Police Department and the Dept of Sanitation to begin immediate enforcement of ADA civil rights laws to protect the rights of the disabled who number over a million people in the city and county, requiring that all tent encampments and other items blocking passage for the disabled, and wheelchair bound, be moved back to ensure a minimum three foot clearance as required under the Americans with Disabilities Act for walkability and wheelchair use, and that if the clearance cannot be met and is not possible, that those tent encampments be removed immediately or relocated where the City deems appropriate. Upon passage, this Resolution shall be forwarded to City Attorney Mike N. Feuer, Mayor Eric Garcetti, Councilman Mike Bonin, President of the Board of Public Works Kevin James, Police Chief Michel R. Moore, and Department of Sanitation General Manager Enrique C. Zaldivar, *Recommended by Homeless Committee* (4,2,0) 8/7/2020

12C Appointment of Election Administrator (Ivan Spiegel, Parliamentarian)

MOTION: The President shall appoint, with the consent of the VNC Board, an Election Administrator to administrate the 2021 VNC Board elections.



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The Election Administrator shall have oversight over all facets of the elections in coordination with the Los Angeles City Clerk NC Elections Division. Specific responsibilities shall include line item execution of the Board-approved election budget; hiring (with approval from the Board) an Election Administrative Assistant; approval of all election outreach materials and events to recruit candidates and encourage voter participation; overseeing the smooth and effective post-election transition to the new Board; and scheduling and organizing the orientation for the new Board.

The Election Administrator shall ensure that all VNC stakeholders are fully and equally encouraged, and have equal opportunity to become candidates for the VNC Board in the 2021 Board elections, and that no VNC-sponsored outreach or event relating to the election favors a subset of candidates, and to the best of his/her ability, ensure that all candidates follow the fair practices guidelines established by the LA City Clerk.

12D Closure of Traffic Lane on N. Venice Blvd. between Electric Avenue and Irving Tabor Court (James Murez on behalf of the Parking & Transportation Committee)

MOTION: Whereas the sidewalk in this location is impassable for pedestrians and has been for months, and the safety of our residents and visitors is of the utmost importance; and Whereas the current condition of sidewalks forces pedestrians and bikers into the traffic lanes on Venice Blvd; and Whereasthis motion would require a change to our bylaws.this motion would require a change to our bylaws. the posted speed limit on that part of Venice Blvd. Is 40 MPH; and Whereas there is an immediate threat to the life and safety of Venice residents and visitors. Therefore be it resolved that the Venice Neighborhood Council calls for the immediate temporary closure of 1 lane vehicle traffic and posted no parking anytime signage on North Venice Blvd. Between Electric and Tabor Court. 12E Masks For The Homeless (Frank Murphy on behalf of the Homeless Committee)

MOTION: Whereas, for the health of everyone in the City of Los Angeles, wearing a mask is required everywhere except in your own home and outdoors when not in close proximity to others. If your body is invaded by the virus, you become a carrier, infecting those with whom you come into contact. You may or may not become ill yourself. All but surgical masks provide one-way protection – if you are wearing it, you are preventing your breath with possible virus content from being inhaled by the people around you. Whereas only if everyone wears a mask is the community as safe as possible. Whereas not everyone, especially the homeless, can afford to buy sufficient masks so they always have a clean one to put on before leaving home. Be it resolved that the Venice Neighborhood Council, through its web site and social media, will encourage stakeholders who sew to make masks to be





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given to Venice's homeless population, and the VNC Homeless Committee will set up the logistics for manufacture and delivery. *Recommended by Homeless Committee 5-2-0 on 2020-06-11*

12F <u>Vote Of No Confidence</u> (Nicholas Antonicello, nantoni@mindspring.com)

MOTION: The Venice Neighborhood Council (VNC) shall formally go on the record and endorse a vote of \"No Confidence\" to LA METRO, Mayor Eric Garcetti, Councilman Mike Bonin and the administrators of both PATH & SPY for their collective failure to provide the basic services promised to the Venice neighborhood and that a Oversight Committee be created of Venice residents who live within a 500 ft. radius of the project as well as other community leaders and Bridge Home vendors so that real and reliable accountability be offered to all that includes crime statistics, duration of stay of program individuals and the percentage of those individuals who complete their time in the Bridge Housing process matriculate to permanent housing.
