Possible Motion: Whereas, since this committee last considered the parking lot project on Hurricane (which is being done in connection with the pumping station project), conditions in Venice have deteriorated, the city has had only minimal enforcement of homelessness related issues, and the neighbors surrounding the project have expressed their belief that the City has not kept its promises to take and consider community input in the design and implementation of the parking lot project, WHEREAS, The City of Los Angeles Director of Planning and Zone Administrator has decided to include unsecured public parking and bicycle rack spaces at 128 Hurricane St, MDR as part of the Venice Auxiliary Pumping Plant in direct opposition to the specific requests of Hurricane St residents. Motion passed 4.0.0

WHEREAS, this will encourage both visitors and homeless to congregate in this residential area. It will also become the only public parking lot on the Marina peninsula excepting the existing parking spaces at the end of the peninsula on the jetty.

The Parking and Transportation Committee requests that the Venice Neighborhood Council send a letter supporting the residents of Hurricane St and withdrawing the VNC's support for the parking lot project until and unless the city addresses the issues of concern to the residents in the area. recommends the parking lot be designated solely for the exclusive use of employees and secured insuch a manner that the public cannot access it whether by vehicle, bicycle or on foot. The letter shall be sent to Elizabeth Gallardo (Project Planning), the LA CPC, Department of Public Works and DOT. Moved by Alison Wilson, Seconded by Jonathan M. Deer. Motion as amended passes 4,0,0.
