Whereas our beach is the most visited park in Los Angeles and

whereas the mission statement of the LA Park Rangers is to provide safe, welcoming parks and recreation facilities for people of all ages to play, learn, contemplate, build a sense of community, and be good stewards of our environment,

the VNC formally requests that a permanent, regularly scheduled Park Ranger presence be initiated, with a substation established at Westminster Park with letters sent to Chief Joe Losarelli (joe.losorelli@lacity.org), Councilmemeber Bonin's office, Mayor Eric Garcetti, and Michael Shull at Rec/ Parks.

11. MOTION: Improve the Conditions of the North Venice Walk Streets (Brian Averill) NA/JR 6/0/0 Revised motion NA/JR 6/0/0

Whereas Palmoa Ave was torn up for repairs and other walk streets in the area are marked for the same;

Whereas Paloma Ave was haphazardly covered over with loose, soft asphalt, which caused the walk street to no longer by ADA compliant.

Therefore, the VNC requests the timely completion of this project and that an immediate solution to this problem be adopted. In addition, as this is an historic walk street area, the same cement materials must be used so as not to damage this historic walk street
