

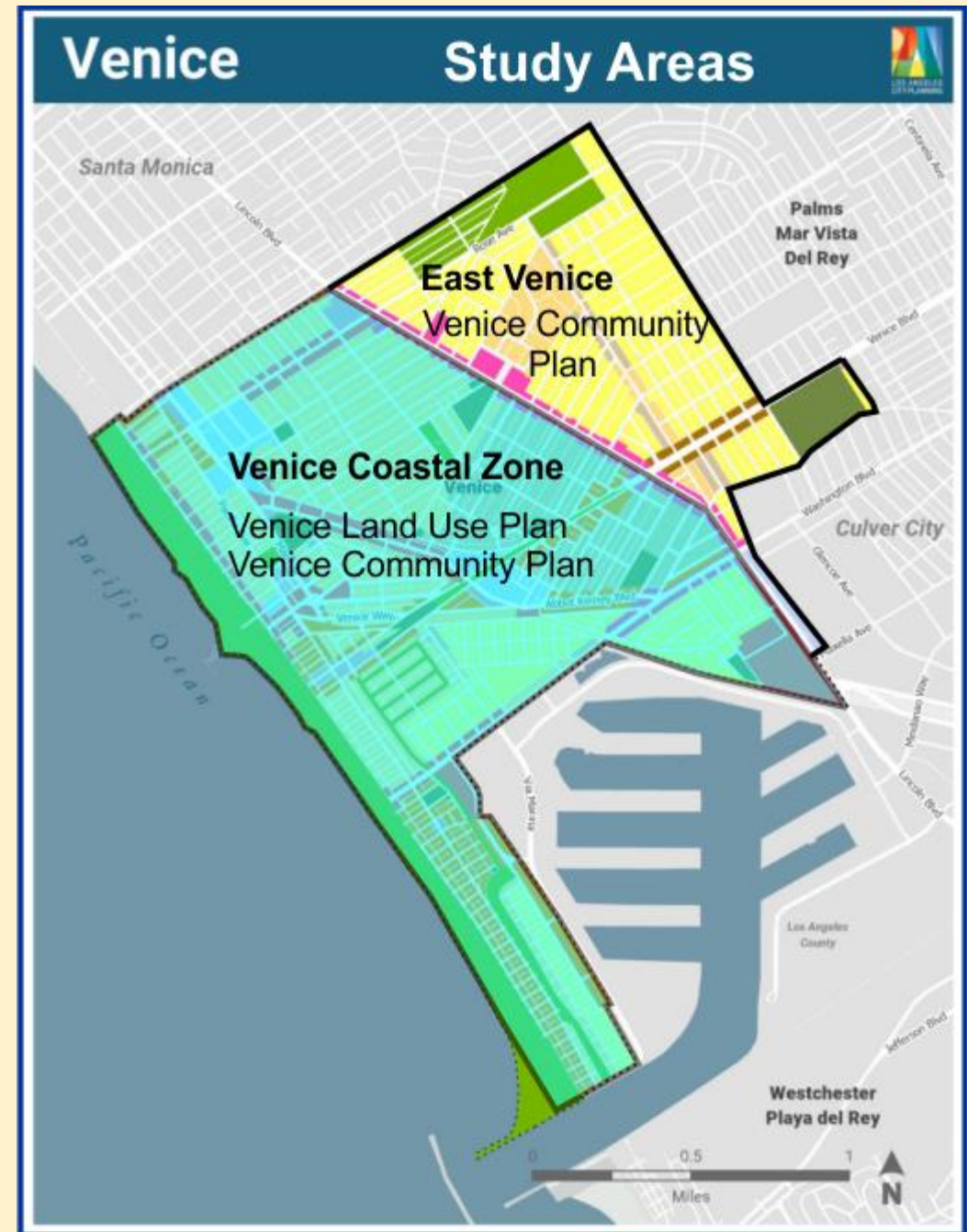
Venice Community Plan and Local Coastal Program Update

Community Plan and Local Coastal Program Ad Hoc Committee
of the
Venice Neighborhood Council

- The mission of the Venice Community Plan (VCP)/Local Coastal Program (LCP) Ad Hoc Committee is for the Neighborhood Council to provide the City recommendations, on behalf of Venice neighborhoods, in the updating of the VCP, which includes all of Venice, and the LCP, which includes only the Coastal Zone of Venice.
- The committee will review documents prepared thus far, outreach to and obtain input from the public, coordinate as necessary with other communities, and prepare recommendations derived from these efforts to the Venice Neighborhood Council.

Background:

- Venice west of Lincoln Boulevard is in the Coastal Zone. Its land use plans must be certified by the California Coastal Commission.



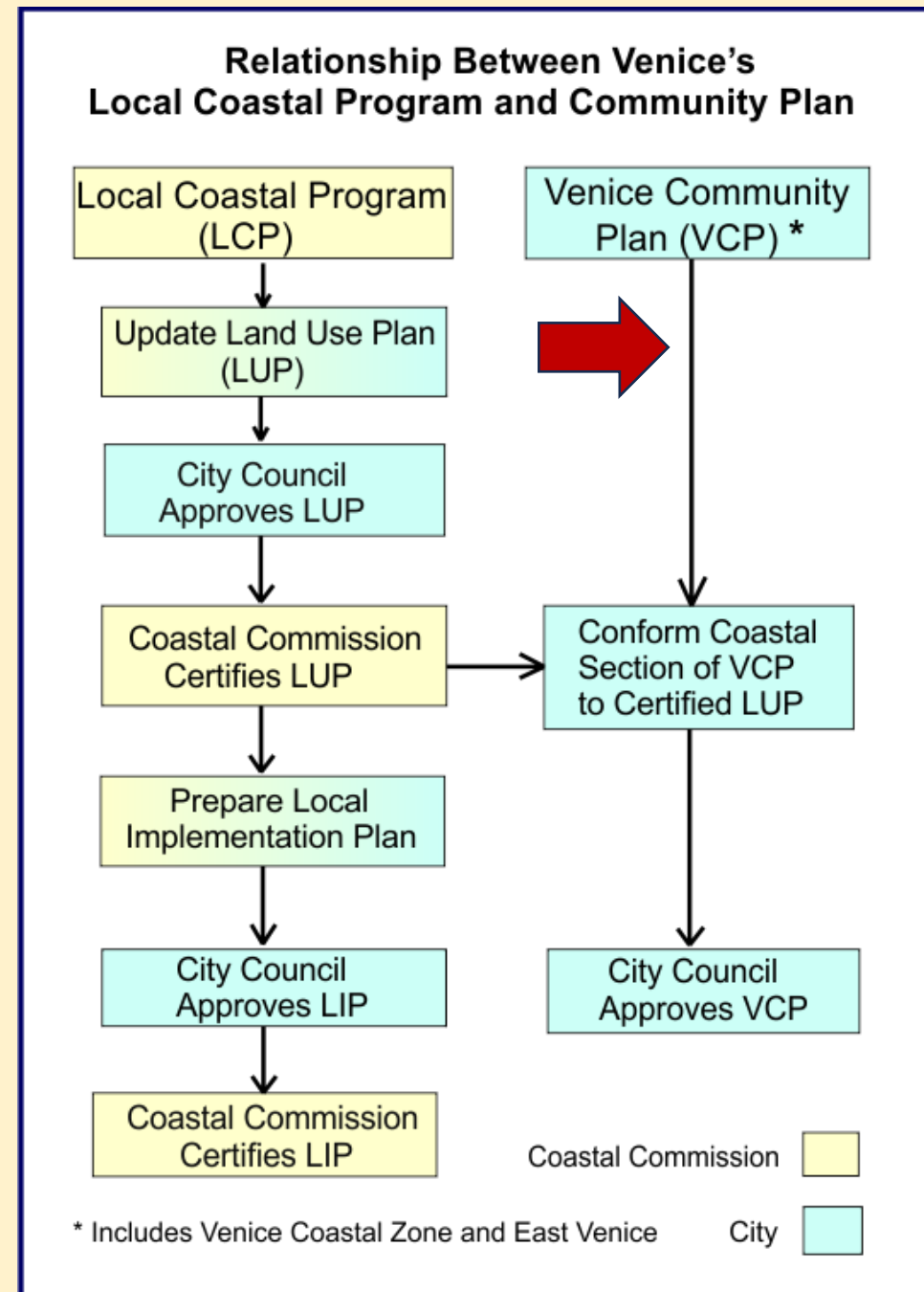
Background:

- Venice is a special coastal community and man-made coastal resource important to all people of California.



Steps in Updating The Plans:

- City Planning has already started updating the 2004 Venice Community Plan, releasing a draft this past August.
- It is also working with a 25-person Advisory Group on all Westside Los Angeles community plans.
- The VNC wants to obtain stakeholder feedback and opinions to input into the City's planning process.



Steps in This Process

- Introductory explanation of process and schedule. (January 10th)
- Weekly neighborhood-by-neighborhood public meetings for public input. (Jan 24th–March 13th)
- “Preference Survey” (on-line through VNC’s email list) and at meetings.
- Sharing of Findings. (March-April)
- Draft Recommendations for Public Review & VNC approval. (April - May)
