#### 9. Senate Bill 50, Introduced by Senator Scott Weiner

#### Description per Senator Weiner:

SB 50 creates new zoning standards for the construction of housing near job centers and public transportation, while protecting against the displacement of renters and vulnerable communities living in those areas. SB 50 eliminates hyper-low-density zoning near transit and job centers, thus legalizing apartment buildings in these locations so that

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more people can live near transit and near where they work. It also reduces or eliminates minimum parking requirements for new developments. SB 50 will help relieve California's acute housing shortage (currently a deficit of 3.5 million homes), make housing more affordable, increase the supply of low-income housing, and reduce pressure to create more sprawl and build in wildfire zones. The bill will also reduce carbon emissions by allowing more people to live near transit and near where they work. SB 50 is modeled on SB 827, which Senator Wiener introduced earlier this year and which did not advance. Since SB 827's demise, Senator Wiener has worked with a broad coalition of stakeholders to recraft the bill, in order to protect vulnerable communities.
