- **7.a Change to Bylaws-**The Venice Neighborhood Council changes the bylaws to define the word "absentee" to mean any board member who misses more than 50% of a regularly scheduled meeting.
- **7.b VNC BYLAWS REVISIONS & CHANGES** (Nick Antonicello, <u>nantoni@mindspring.com</u>, 6092831346)

WHEREAS, the selection of the Parliamentarian is currently a direct appointment by the President, and

WHEREAS, the entire VNC has no advice and consent despite the fact the Parliamentarian works for the entire board.

MOTION: effective immediately the Parliamentarian be nominated by the President with the advice and consent of the VNC and serve at the pleasure of the President.

WHEREAS, the Elections Committee Chair is a direct appointment of the President with no input from any standing committee, and

WHEREAS, the Outreach Committee is the appropriate committee of responsibility for this outreach function,

MOTION: the Outreach Chair be responsible for appointing the Election Chair and that the Committee be composed of at least five (5) stakeholders moving forward (including the Chair).

WHEREAS, the current election of Community Officers is limited to stakeholders selecting a single individual when in fact these board members constitute 58% of the entire board, and WHEREAS, stakeholders are being denied the ability to vote for 100% of the board's membership and currently only select 38% of the board's members, and WHEREAS, the current selection process is in violation of one-man, one-vote guidelines, MOTION: the Stakeholders of Venice shall vote and select all thirteen (13) Community Officers in future elections moving forward.

7.c Change by laws so all board members can vote on adcom members (Melissa Diner (secretary@venicenc.org)

MOTION: The Venice Neighborhood Council changes the bylaws for the administrative committee to allow all board members to vote on adcom members.

7.d Change to By-Laws - Recess per year in Dec. or Jan. minimum

MOTION: Whereas we are volunteers and whereas the commissions, city council, state and federal government many who are paid get multiply recesses annually, and whereas we lost a lot of great board members due to burn out and conflicting, unenforceable bylaws/standing rules, therefore be it resolved that the VNC will have 1 recess(month off of all meetings for the month of Dec. or January annually to honor our community servants and represent that we support adequate rest to promote participation in community service.

MOTION: to Open Questioning of Representatives During Government Reports VNC Board meetings represent a unique opportunity for Board members to engage representatives of government, legislative officeholders and city departments in discussions on various city matters. Thus, the Board moves to ask the president of the VNC to allow Board members to ask questions on any topics related to Venice or the City of Los Angeles of representatives of government and legislative offices and city departments when they make presentations to the Board at our monthly meetings during \"Government Reports.
