NOTED FOR FUTURE:

Both Public and Committee members were very concerned about the errors discovered in the City's Hearing Notice and it was requested the in future Applicants inform the VNC/LUPC of such errors so that they can inform interested parties. In this case the errors were in indicating project specifications



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that were in excess of standards, so it was decided that a revised hearing notice and hearing would not be necessitated, but had the errors been such that the hearing notice indicated compliance and in fact the project was out of compliance, a revised hearing notice and hearing must be provided by the *City*.
