MOTION: The VNC hereby creates the Ad Hoc Business Committee with the following Mission Statement, as approved by AdCom:

Mission Statement: The AdHoc Business Committee shall enhance the vitality of life in Venice by supporting existing local businesses, encouraging entrepreneurship and attracting new business and employment opportunities to Venice and Venice residents, and to advocate for the development of public policy and strategies that result in balanced and sustainable economic growth. The Committee shall expire after one year or the seating of a new Board, whichever comes first.

- A 2536 Lincoln Blvd; Case No: ZA-2014-1613-PAD; Addition of a 440 sf outdoor patio with food and alcoholic beverage service to an existing 2,317 sf music venue: Under 12.24M, a Plan Approval to allow the 19% expansion of a deemed-approved conditional use for on-site existing bar/music venue with on-site alcohol sales that has been operating continuously since 1969; and under 12.24L, a



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request to establish deemed-approved status for an existing bar/music venue with on-site alcohol sales that has been operating continuously since 1969.

MOTION: The VNC Board recommends that the project as set forth on Exhibit A, page A.1 of the Plot Plan as of 7-29-14, with the following conditions:

- 1. HVAC installed, which is enclosed to baffle noise to the neighborhood
- 2. Rear door to be used for emergency exit only, which will remain closed when not in use, which has an alarm and will be enclosed by a protective wall on the outside.
- 3. Plan approval within one year of approval;, unless all residential property owners within 200', as well as the first 3 property owners across Lincoln on both sides of Grant, sign off that they have been no complaints.
- 4. A parking covenant for the additional 4 spaces (and not a contract), and that there will be no leasing of the parking lot to other uses besides the tenants on the property.
- 5. A free bike valet will be implemented.
- 6. Security cameras will be installed on the alley side, and the video feed will be made available to nearby residents on request.
- **B MOTION:** The VNC Board recommends that L.A. City Planning inform AT&T, and any other applicants who are not cooperative in getting the VNC's recommendation on their case, that they must coordinate with the VNC to go through their process in order to receive the VNC's recommendation PRIOR TO the date of their City Hearing.
- **C MOTION:** The VNC Board recommends that the L.A. City Council support AB2222, currently in the State Senate, which amends SB1818.
- D 320 Sunset; Case Nos: ZA-2013-3376-CDP-CUB-SPP and ENV-2013-3377-MND and ZA-2013-1317-CEX and DIR-2013-1314-VSO; Change of use from bakery/bakery accessory to bakery/bakery accessory/restaurant/take-out restaurant/with CUB for on-sale full line of liquor/off-sale beer and wine only.

MOTION:

The VNC recommends denial of the project at 320 Sunset Ave, as it is currently designed. The LUPC also recommends that the VNC inform the Applicant that the VNC would SUPPORT a new project application which contains the following terms and restrictions in the application itself:

- 1. A bakery with sale of baked goods, sandwiches, and accessories, but with no table service;
- 2. No more than 25 indoor seats without table service, fully enclosed as required, with the service floor area including path of travel commensurate with the indoor seats. No outdoor seating with the area immediately south of the structure to be used instead as dedicated parking for patrons;
- 3. No sales of alcohol on or off-site;
- 4. Free parking for all employees during their shift, either on-site or within 750' of the site;
- 5. The application include provision for a covenant for the lot immediately west of the structure to be used as parking for bakery patrons in perpetuity, so long as 320 Sunset operates as a retail establishment:
- 6. The curb directly in front of the premises shall not be used as a loading zone or designated as a loading zone or as parking for the exclusive use of the bakery, or as a valet spot;
- 7. All deliveries to be completed by 9 a.m.
- 8. All trash collection to be done Monday through Saturday, via Sunset Avenue only.

- A <u>Deterioration of Venice Bike Path</u> (5 minutes) (Nick Antonicello, <u>nacount@aol.com</u>)

MOTION: WHEREAS, the Venice Bike Path has fallen into serious disrepair due to the erosion and deterioration of the grassy area that separates OFW from the path and,

WHEREAS, numerous attempts have been made by written and oral correspondence to the 11th Council District Office as well as the Harbors & Beaches Department of the County of Los Angeles, and

WHEREAS, the Los Angeles City Council has now mandated Segways to only travel along the bike path making for increased traffic, and

WHEREAS, erosion of these knolls has resulted in a permanent hazard for bicyclists along the due north access because of spilling sand that forces bicyclists to stray outside of their appropriate lanes, and

WHEREAS, on windy days the sand accumulation stops bicycle traffic in both directions, and WHEREAS, the best way to get tourists and residents out of cars is to offer a safe and accessible bike path that relieves the strain of surface traffic closest to Venice Beach, and WHEREAS, the probability of accidents is highly likely given the current condition of a bike path not renovated or upgraded in decades,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Venice Neighborhood Council (VNC) that a letter be sent to the 11th Council District Office as well as the Third District Supervisor's Office that the deficiencies of the Venice Bike Path be addressed with a capital improvement plan in cooperation with both the City and County.

- Adopt, in concept, a Citywide street vending program and provide recommendations to facilitate, fund and improve the formation and implementation of Special Sidewalk Vending Districts citywide

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improve the enforcement of street vendors including personnel and budget impacts

BE IT RESOLVED that the Venice Neighborhood Council opposes the report because it fails to study the impact on residential areas and does not acknowledge that existing commercial/restaurants (which pay sales tax) may lose business to street vendors.
