Many of these items contain toxic substances and must be disposed of carefully. The company that picks up the E-Waste is ERS (<u>www.ers2recycle.com</u>), and they are approved by the California Integrated Waste Management Board. ERS will work with the Venice Farmers Market to have a manned truck with knowledgeable E-waste persons who can take items dropped off by Venice residents and dispose of those items in an appropriate way.

MOTION: Whereas, the Venice Neighborhood Council is concerned about child safety, and has received numerous complaints about the intersection of Coeur d'Alene Ave. and Abbot Kinney Boulevards, the location of the main crossing route for hundreds of elementary school children and families who cross Abbot Kinney Blvd to attend Coeur d'Alene Elementary School, and Whereas this intersection, with the existing traffic driving patterns, triangulation problems, cross walk deterioration, vehicle speeds and ineffective current mitigation efforts have made the intersection of Abbot Kinney Blvd. and Coeur d'Alene Ave. unsafe, and

Whereas, this intersection is the location of continuing accidents involving vehicles, pedestrians and bicyclists,

Therefore, be it resolved, the Venice Neighborhood Council calls on the Los Angeles Mayor's office and LA City Council District 11 office to work with the LA Department of Transportation to





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develop a Safe Passages grant application to place a traffic signal light system enabling students to cross the street on demand while controlling vehicle traffic at the intersection of Abbot Kinney Blvd. and Coeur d'Alene.

Any member of the Board of Officers of the VNC who has a financial or material pecuniary interest in an item, as defined by State, Federal or local laws, shall recuse themselves from voting on any item in question.

Board members must receive a certificate of completion for the mandated Ethics training within 55 days of taking office, whether by appointment or election, or they will be prohibited from voting on any land use issues or financial expenditures of any city funds. This Standing Rule shall also apply to all members of the Budget and Land Use and Planning Committees effective August 1, 2013.

G <u>Request for VNC support of Preferential Parking Districts</u> Marie Hammond mhamm007@aol.com

MOTION: Whereas, the City of Los Angeles and California Coastal Commission have allowed the proliferation of more intensive commercial and restaurant uses on several corridors in Venice, including Rose Avenue and Abbot Kinney Boulevard, without requiring adequate parking for the increased number of patrons of these businesses; and Whereas, this intensification in use and the increasing popularity of these corridors has resulted in a dramatic increase in the number of patrons drawn to Venice and the corresponding loss of parking for residents, and

Whereas, the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (DOT) has announced that it will present to the Coastal Commission at the Commission's June hearing a request for an "approval in concept" of a preferential parking program for blocks within 1500 feet of these commercial corridors that would significantly relieve the negative consequences of this loss of parking by reserving parking from 6 PM to 8 AM to residents with permits and limiting daytime parking to either two hours or four hours (depending on proximity to the beach) for visitors, with no restrictions during the daytime for residents with permits, and

Whereas, such a program would be established by the petition of residents in a several block area adjacent to a commercial corridor, and





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Whereas, the Venice Neighborhood Council is on record in support of Overnight Restricted Parking (OPDs) for residents and has yet to take a position on the Preferential Parking (PPD) proposal,

Therefore, be it resolved that the Venice Neighborhood Council herewith supports the preferential parking program for Venice's commercial corridors proposed by DOT and urges the California Coastal Commission to endorse it.
