 MOTION: Whereas the rock group, "The Doors" is recognized as having a globally transformative impact on both popular music and popular culture and; Whereas Venice CA is historically considered the birthplace of "The Doors" and; Whereas January 4, 2017 will mark the 50th anniversary of the release of the "The Doors" first album, Therefore Be It Resolved that the Venice NC shall send a letter to Mayor Eric Garcetti, Councilman Mike Bonin and the Los Angeles Department of Cultural Affairs recommending that January 4th be recognized as "The Day of The Doors" in Los Angeles.

MOTION: Whereas the bushes overhanging the sidewalk of 18th St. between Pacific Ave. and Speedway are hanging down to about four feet above the ground and completely block the sidewalk from pedestrian access, and

Whereas this is a safety hazard because it forces people to walk in the very narrow street, Therefore Be It Resolved that the VNC Board recommends that the Department Of Public Works, Street Maintenance Bureau remove the bushes that are overhanging the sidewalk on 18th St. between Pacific Ave. and Speedway.

MOTION: Whereas an innovative pilot program exists that puts homeless individuals back in touch with family, friends and loved ones via a Social Media Program, and

Whereas similar programs have been executed in other municipalities with a 40% success rate of getting homeless off the streets and living with loved ones and a 90% success rate of connecting them with their loved ones in a positive manner, and

Whereas Miracle Messages and Safe Place for Youth have already offered their services for such a program,

Therefore Be It Resolved that the VNC supports this program to be held in Venice during the second week of December 2016 to coincide with the holiday season and encourages other local organizations to participate as well.
