Identifying key vulnerabilities unique to Venice Beach; 6. Prioritizing actions; 7. Carefully assessing adaptation options; 8. Including short-term adaptation measures; 9. Collaborating with all levels of government; 10. Recognizing potential barriers to implementation; and 11. Increasing public engagement for adaptation through robust outreach and education. *Recommended by Neighborhood Committee 9-0-1 on April 26, 2017.*
