PROVIDE AN EARLIER, CONCRETE DATE FOR PERMANENT AND RETRACTABLE BOLLARDS TO BE INSTALLED AND REPLACE ALL K-RAILS THAT WERE PUT IN PLACE JULY 2017

#### Motion:

Whereas, on July 2017, K Rails were installed as a temporary measure per National Security on OFW; and

Whereas per CD11 Taylor Bazley announced at the OFW Meeting, February 26, 2018, stated that the K-Rails are to be replaced with permanent or retractable bollards, depending on the locations on OFW, by end of the fiscal year, or beginning of 2019; and

Whereas the K-Rails were set up as a temporary fix, and the public were informed they would not be up more than 6 months; and

Whereas the community feels that the K-Rails have created a nuisance with people utilizing them to tent, camp, litter, attract graffiti, as well as create a safety hazard in reference to access to get on and off the Boardwalk.

Therefore, the VNC will send a letter to: CD Councilman Mike Bonin, Chief Charlie Beck, Recs & Park Robert Davis, and County Supervisor Sheila Kuehl that an earlier and solid date is provided to the community for the temporary and permanent bollards to be installed.
