12B. Amend Neighborhood Council Role in the Cannabis Licensing Process (Cindy Chambers on behalf of Cannabis Committee cindy.chambers@venicenc.org)

MOTION: WHEREAS the Los Angeles City Municipal Code outlines criteria upon which the Department of Cannabis Regulation (DCR) may deny, with no hearing and based upon written findings and evidence in the record, the issuance of a license where the applicant fails to meet any of the requirements of Article 5 of Chapter X of the Code; and, WHEREAS community input is a benefit for





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both stakeholders and applicants and

WHEREAS Venice stakeholders value the uniqueness and history of our community; THEREFORE the Venice Neighborhood Council shall send a letter to the LA City Council, Councilmember Mike Bonin, and Cat Packer, executive director of the DCR requesting that the LA City Council amend the existing ordinance to include the language: "... including but not limited to, failure to appear in front of the nearest Neighborhood Council of the proposed location of the business premises in compliance with section 104.05(a), or the Rules and Regulations; (ix) Upon notice of Neighborhood Council opposition of an Application, the DCR Commission shall make written findings addressing the basis of the Neighborhood Council's opposition; or ...".

12C. Bicycle Chop Shops (George Francisco on behalf of the Neighborhood Committee vp@venicenc.org) MOTION: Whereas bicycle chop shops have become an increasing hazard to residents, businesses and visitors as well as a blight to the community;

Therefore the VNC recommends to Councilman Bonin, the LA City Council, the LA District Attorney and the LAPD to create an ordinance modeled on the City of San Francisco's Public Works Code Order 203-17 which prohibits the assembly, disassembly, sale, offer of sale, distribution, offer of distribution, or storage of bicycles and bicycle parts on the public right-of-ways, under certain conditions and with certain exceptions, and authorizes the removal and seizure of bicycles and bicycle parts following issuance of a notice of violation.

MOTION: Whereas motorized vehicles (scooters & bikes) are still an issue on Ocean Front Walk and the Bike Path, because these vehicles are operating on those pathways; and

Whereas, these vehicles are creating safety issues for pedestrians, locals, and tourists; and Whereas, there is a high probability that the vehicle users are uninsured; and

Whereas, the one person rider restriction is not being enforced;

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12E. Youth Internship Program

MOTION: Whereas, the Discussion Forum Committee of the VNC exists to "Provide a monthly forum for discussion of long-term matters affecting the Venice Community within the context of the VNC Vision Goals"; and

Whereas, the Discussion Forum Committee has resolved to turn its efforts to the "Focus on Children" Vision Goal; and

Whereas, the "Focus on Children" Vision Goal establishes that the VNC will "Consider strategies that promote & expand opportunities for children to experience direct meaningful involvement in all aspects of the social and economic and cultural activities of the Venice Community"; and Whereas, Internship with local agencies and businesses is an established means by which suitably mature young people may learn and grow in their capacity to be active community members on social, economic, and cultural fronts (in keeping with their personal and career interests), while providing useful service; and

Whereas, facilitation of a structured Youth Internship Program uniting eligible young people and local agencies, businesses and artists would be of meaningful benefit to Interns, their local hosts, and the community at large;

Therefore be it resolved that the VNC Board is supportive of the DFC's efforts to investigate and implement the creation of a Youth Internship Program, and that such a program could draw on the participation of DFC members and interested parties at the VNC and in the Venice community. This internship program would involve engagement with suitable staff at local middle schools, high schools, and agencies who may have access to interested young persons, as well as outreach with businesses and other accomplished entities who have the opportunity to host eligible interns. The internship program would promote the uniting of interested young people with organizations where they could serve for a period of time. Any actual DFC/VNC activities directed at encouraging internships would be approved by the VNC Board in subsequent motions, upon DFC's presentation of further information regarding potential partners to the DFC in these efforts, appropriate eligibility requirements for interns (ie age range, etc.), any relevant guidelines and regulations, and appropriate measures for limiting potential liability. Findings in support of such future motions would be presented to the Board and the public at general Board Meetings.
