Resolution to Modify LAPD Personnel Allocation Formula to Include Transient

Populations (Mark Ryavec, mark.ryave@venicenc.org)

MOTION: Resolution to Modify LAPD Personnel Allocation Formula to Include Transient Populations Whereas, Venice has seen a significant increase in Aggravated Assaults and Grand Theft Auto incidents, and Whereas, the year-to-year increase in unsheltered persons in Venice of January 2020 was 57%, which was before the on-start of the Covid-19 Pandemic, and Whereas, Venice residents report a significantly larger population of homeless individuals and an increase in encampments, spreading to areas of Venice previously without encampments, along with increases in public defecation and urination, late night noise, trash and debris and food waste on streets, sidewalks and alleys, break-ins, vandalism,

intimidation and threats directed at residents and tourists and homeless themselves, and Whereas, 50% of Pacific Division's reported Aggravated Assaults are either between transients or committed by transients, and Whereas, residents have called for more police presence, not less, to address the increase in crime, and Whereas, the LAPD contracts with an independent firm to determine the allocation of LAPD officers throughout the city using a formula, which does not count transients – either homeless or tourists, Now, therefore be it resolved that the Venice Neighborhood Council calls upon the Los Angeles Police Department to revise its personnel allocation formula to count transients – including the "Persons Experiencing Homelessness" (PEH) population, and tourists visiting Venice for the day and those staying in Venice hotels and motels, to more fairly allocate police officers citywide.

MOTION: : WHEREAS, ZOOM meetings are now the preferred mode of communication of all VNC meetings and it\'s respective committees, and WHEREAS, during \"public comment\" many attendees refuse to offer a name or any affiliation to the Venice Neighborhood Council as a stakeholder or otherwise, and WHEREAS, on numerous occasions these \"anonymous\" participants are willfully and intentionally disrupting said meetings as well as using language that is vulgar and offensive for a public meeting or forum, and WHEREAS, these individuals in many cases are non-stakeholders with no connection to Venice as witnessed at the last meeting of the Homelessness Committee that had to be summarily adjourned due to constant shouting, heckling and interruption of others who did not agree with the point-of-view of other attendees and callers who were in fact Venice Stakeholders, and WHEREAS, such intentional behavior cannot be tolerated nor encouraged as it disrupts the committee to do it/'s business and function, and WHEREAS, cursing, and verbally assaulting and threatening of other ZOOM participants under \"public comment\" is in violation of the VNC\'s \"Code of Conduct,\" as well as it\'s BY-LAW\'s, STANDING RULES and ROBERT\'S RULES OF ORDER, and WHEREAS, Venice stakeholders should be given preference to non-stakeholder\'s when it comes to the order of speakers under \"public comment,\" THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that all Venice stakeholder\'s be given preference under all \"public comment\" on any agenda item and that all speakers give a legitimate first and last name before addressing these public bodies and that a letter be sent to the City Attorney\'s Office as to the appropriateness of such a process by this and other Neighborhood Councils here in the City of Los Angeles.
