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MOTION: The Venice Neighborhood Council shall send a letter to DPW Street Services and CD11 requesting that the City restore weekly street sweeping to Venice. If alternate street sweeping must continue, the VNC recommends reconsideration of schedule to be weekly on all commercial and heavily impacted residential streets which serve beach and visitor access.

MOTION: The Venice Neighborhood Council supports the Community Forest Advisory Committee's position letter calling for an increase in the percentage of the city's overall budget allocated for support and development of the city's tree canopy from .25% to 1%, starting with the city's 2021-22 budget. Letters shall be sent to City Councilman Paul Krekorian, Chair, City Council's Budget and Finance Committee, Councilman Mike Bonin, and Mayor Eric Garcetti."

- 9C Lincoln Blvd – Proposed Cannabis Store** (James Murez on behalf of the Parking & Transportation Committee) (james.murez@venicenc.org)

MOTION: The Venice Neighborhood Council shall send a letter to the applicant, DCR, CC Planning Dept. and file a CIS (CF .21-0420-S39) as follows: The Venice Neighborhood Council recommends denial of permit request as presented due to inadequate parking plan. The applicant proposed valet parking using the nearby residential alley for customer loading and did not identify any off street parking location for customers, employees or the proposed valet service. Furthermore, the LADOT responded to VNC inquire about Trip Count of the current Retail Use (5/Hour) vs. proposed Retail Cannabis Use (20/hour) which requires the applicant to apply for and receive a Coastal Development Permit. No CDP is documented by the DCR case file nor did the applicant have one available at the Parking & Transportation Committee meeting.

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12A Observation Deck - Ballona Lagoon Marine Preserve (James Murez)(james.murez@venicenc.org)

MOTION: Whereas, in the early 1990's a group of local citizens created a non-profit called Ballona Lagoon Marine Preserve (BLMP) whose mission was to restore the banks of the lagoon with environmentally correct plant life and raise money to create a public observation deck where endangered wildlife could be viewed. (See Coastal Commission 1996 Permit <https://documents.coastal.ca.gov/reports/1996/1/W18b-1-1996.pdf>); and Whereas, the walkway and deck have continuously served the general public for recreation, to students and school field trips for educational uses; and

Whereas access to the area below the walkway and deck is causing a public nuisance and danger to the nearby homes because of the illegal cooking and open fires under the deck structure; and

Whereas these conditions create a high fire hazard environment to both the dry native plant life and structures in the dense surrounding residential neighborhood

Therefore Be It Resolved the the Venice Neighborhood Council shall send a letter to LA County Supervisor Kuehl, CD11, LA City Rec and Parks Commission and LA City Public Works Commissioners, Coastal Commission Executive Director Jack Ainsworth (John.Ainsworth@coastal.ca.gov), Adel Hagekhalil, Gary Harris, Steven Chen requesting a solution be created that eliminates access to the area below the aerial walkway and lookout platform areas. Furthermore, the ADA compliant walkway and the lookout platform deck should be repaired and restored to a safe condition that allows public access. Lastly, we request that LAFD and LAPD become more actively involved with enforcing all safety and fire prevention regulations in this area.

12B Temporary Signs Need More Regulation (James Murez)(james.murez@venicenc.org)

MOTION: The Venice Neighborhood Council submit a CIS (Council File 17-0893).stating the VNC is not in support of off-site advertising on Temporary Fences past the expiration date of LADBS construction or fence permit on which said advertising is attached. Furthermore, the VNC does not support any internally illuminated signs on Temporary Fences.

12C Bus Landing Pads (James Murez on behalf of the Parking & Transportation Committee) (james.murez@venicenc.org)

MOTION: Whereas, the conditions at bus loading pads that exist at present in many locations throughout the Venice area exceed the maximum gap of ½", and Whereas a bicycle tire can easily get stuck in a gap over ½" causing a very dangerous condition for riders, and

Whereas the joint between the landing pad and street normally falls within the designated bike lane

Therefore be it resolved that the Venice Neighborhood Council shall send a letter to Dept. of Public Works Commission, CC CD11 requesting all bus loading pads (concrete areas at bus stops) and the abutting asphalt street be maintained in such a way to reduce the gap between these two materials to less than 1/2" in width.

Recommended by Parking & Transportation Committee 6-0-0.



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12D Resolution to Restore Full Funding for LAPD and Street Sweeping **(mark.ryevec@venicenc.org)**

Whereas, the City of Los Angeles has reduced the LAPD 2020-21 budget by \$155 million dollars; and

Whereas, this misguided action has resulted in a reduction of the Venice Beach Detail from 42 to 26 officers; and

Whereas, this has resulted in a recent spike in crime:

Car thefts (Officer Contreras and Officer Acosta car areas combined) up 37.5% Year Over Year for the reporting period between 1/1 and 1/30;

Aggravated Assaults (Officer Contreras and Officer Acosta car areas combined) up 214% Year Over Year for the reporting period between 1/1 and 1/30;

Total violent crimes (including aggravated assaults, robberies, rapes, and homicides, Officer Contreras and Officer Acosta car areas combined) up 233% Year Over Year for the reporting period between 1/1 and 1/30;

Total property crime (including burglary, GTA, burglary/theft from vehicle, and theft) (Officer Contreras and Officer Acosta car areas combined) up 18.5% Year Over Year for the reporting period between 1/1 and 1/30; and

Whereas, 41% of all aggravated assaults in Pacific Division occurred in the Venice district (from 2020 stats) and 45% of all aggravated assaults in 2020 involved a transient (from 2020 stats); and

Whereas, in response to a short fall in city revenues due to the pandemic, the city Bureau of Street Services has cut street sweeping from every week to every other week; and

Whereas, as temperatures warm and the City of Los Angeles eases pandemic-related closures and restrictions, it is anticipated that there will be a return of tens of thousands of visitors to Venice Beach, along with the presence of copious amounts of trash and debris on our streets; and

Whereas, the City of Los Angeles will receive \$1.35 billion in new, unexpected funds from the recently passed American Rescue Plan; now,

Therefore, be it resolved that the Venice Neighborhood Council calls upon the City of Los Angeles to fully restore the 2020-21 LAPD budget to its level as originally adopted, to continue that level of funding into subsequent years, return the Venice Beach Detail to its earlier strength, and return to every week street sweeping as soon as possible.

Upon passage this Resolution shall be sent as a Community Impact Statement to the councilman of the district (mike.bonin@lacity.org, nisa.kove@lacity.org), Mayor Eric Garcetti (Eric.Garcetti@lacity.org, brad.fingard@lacity.org), the Los Angeles City Council's Public Safety Committee (Committee Legislative Assistants: Keyonna.Kidd@lacity.org, Rita.Moreno@lacity.org and Dennis.Gleason@lacity.org), Dept. of Transportation GM Seleta Reynolds (seleta.reynolds@lacity.org) and Bureau of Street Services GM Adel Hagekhalil (adel.hagekhalil@lacity.org).
