10A VCHC REES DAVIDSON COMMUNITY

WHEREAS the Reese-Davidson Community is a proposed supportive and affordable housing development on

2.65 acres of open space on Grand Canal, approximately one block from Venice Beach and the southern

entrance to the Venice Boardwalk;

WHEREAS the Reese-Davidson Community will comprise 140 units, in addition to retail space, a restaurant,

community center, roof decks, an observation tower and parking;

WHEREAS Venice Beach, the Venice Boardwalk and the Historic Venice Canals are of incalculable value to

Venice and the entire City of Los Angeles;

WHEREAS the Reese-Davidson Community commenced the City approval process on January 13, 2021 with a

hearing before the Deputy Advisory Agency of the Los Angeles Planning Department;

WHEREAS the developers of the proposed Reese-Davidson Community—the Hollywood Community Housing

Corporation and the Venice Community Housing Corporation—have sought a complete exemption from

environmental review for the project;

WHEREAS neither of the developers presented project plans to the Venice Neighborhood Council or any of its

committees prior to filing the application and entitlement requests for the Reese-Davidson Community with the

City Planning Department;

WHEREAS the Reese-Davidson Community is one of more than a dozen new and pending homeless housing

and shelter projects in Venice;

WHEREAS the community group Venice Vision has gathered extensive information regarding the Reese-

Davidson Community through public records requests and other means over a period of four years;

WHEREAS Venice Vision made an edifying presentation regarding the Reese-Davidson Community at the

February 25, 2021 meeting of the Land Use and Planning Committee ("LUPC") of the Venice Neighborhood

Council:

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12C Resolution to Retain Weekly Street Sweeping Services Near the Boardwalk and Commercial Corridors at Venice Beach (email for committee)

MOTION: Whereas, Venice Beach, its Boardwalk, and commercial corridors, including Rose Avenue, Abbot Kinney Boulevard, and sections of Main Street and Washington Boulevard, are major tourist destinations, hosting over 10 million visitors annually, and Whereas, most of these millions of tourists park along commercial streets and in residential neighborhoods adjacent to these commercial corridors; and Whereas, these visitors routinely deposit massive amounts of food waste, food wrappers and containers, and beverage bottles on city streets and in gutters next to where they park and along streets and gutters which are the common pathways to and from the Beach, Boardwalk, and restaurants and shops, now Therefore, be it resolved that the Venice Neighborhood Council calls upon the city to return to once-a-week street sweeping within two blocks of the Beach, the Boardwalk, commercial sections of Main Street, Rose Avenue, commercial sections of Abbot Kinney Boulevard, and commercial sections of Washington Boulevard, and And upon passage this Resolution shall be submitted to Mayor Eric Garcetti (Mayor Garcetti@lacity.org, Brad Fingard@lacity.org), Councilman Mike Bonin (Mike.Bonin@lacity.org, Nisa.Kove@lacity.org) and General Manager of Street Services Adel Hagekhalil (Adel.Hagekhalil@lacity.org).

Request Title: Sanitation of OFW - Removal of Encampments/Vaccination of the Homeless

Agenda Motion Request: WHEREAS, the Venice Oceanfront Walk has been inundated with homeless encampments in the hundreds that are dangerous, unsafe, filthy and in need of immediate clean-up, and WHEREAS, the multitude of encampments have had a negative impact on boardwalk tourism, commerce and business occupancy, and WHEREAS, the recent fire at the Venice Boardwalk only validates the lack of social spacing, mask wearing and unsafe conditions that are a threat to residents, tourists as well as the un-housed community, and WHEREAS, the current conditions are intolerable and fly in the face of the cleaning that must be done on a regular basis to further prevent the spread of COVID-19 in and outside the homeless encampments, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oceanfront Walk Committee requests the Venice Neighborhood Council to go on the record and endorse a comprehensive cleanup and sanitation of Oceanfront Walk which would include the removal of all tents and encampments in such a process that these individuals be given priority for COVID-19 vaccinations and to be housed indoors in a designated and much more safer and cleaner area within Venice so that Oceanfront Walk can once again function as a primary tourist destination dependent upon visitation by vacationers and visitors so that this venue be restored again as one of the most





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popular venues within the State of California and that those retailers, restaurants and others who depend on foot traffic for their economic survival be offered the sanitation and cleanup

services necessary to restore Oceanfront Walk to it\'s previous status as a diverse, economic engine for our community and southern California and that a copy of this resolution be sent to California Senator Ben Allen, California Assembly member Autumn Burke, the LA County Board of Supervisors and to LA Mayor Eric Garcetti and the Los Angeles City Council.
