Summary of Motions Introduced (*New Legislation*)

Council File 23-0002-S1 Independent Redistricting Process / New Commission / New Redistricting Maps / City of Los Angeles / April 2023 Special Election (*Rodriguez - Price*): Introduced on October 28, 2022 and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. The Resolution is requesting that the City of Los Angeles include in its 2023-2024 State Legislative Program SPONSORSHIP and SUPPORT of any legislation applicable to any city with a population greater than three million which would urge the State of California through an emergency clause to move forward expeditiously on a Bill structured similarly to Senate Bill (SB) 958 “County of Los Angeles Citizens Redistricting Commission” (Lara – Hall) that creates an independent process with a new commission and new redistricting maps for the City of Los Angeles before the April 2023 special elections.

Council File 22-1285, Rules of the City Council / Censured Councilmember / Charter Amendment (*Harris-Dawson – Krekorian - Bonin*): Introduced on October 26, 2022 and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee.

The motion is requesting the Chief Legislative Analyst and the City Attorney to report with recommendations that amend the Rules of the City Council to include a list of potential consequences that can be imposed upon a censured Councilmember, including but not limited to the limiting a censured Councilmember's ability to use discretionary funds and authorize contracts; Restricting a censured Councilmember's participation in Council Committees until the end of their term, or until the Council overturns their censure; and limiting a censured Councilmember's ability to introduce certain types of Motions.

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Council File 22-0822-S1, Land Use Measure / March 2024 Ballot / Economic Analysis / Hotel Industry / Transient Occupancy Tax / Vacant Hotel Rooms / Unhoused Individuals / Illegal Short-Term Rentals / Single-Night Voucher Program (*Rodriguez – Blumenfield*): Introduced on October 26, 2022 and referred to Budget and Finance Committee. Motion is directing the Chief Administrative Office of Economic Analysis to conduct an economic analysis of the "Land Use" measure that will be on the March 2024 ballot and analyze how it could affect the hotel industry with an emphasis on impacts to the Transient Occupancy Tax, convention business, employment levels, potential to increase illegal short term rental demand in the city, and direct costs to the City.

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Council File 22-0051-S1, 2022 Officer-Involved Shooting Instances / Bi-Annual Report (*Board of Police Commissioners*): Introduced on October 28, 2022 and referred to Public Safety Committee. The Board of Police Commissioners report is relative to the Los Angeles Police Department's Response to Los Angeles City Council Public Safety Committee.

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Council File 22-1284, Los Angeles Unified School District Board of Education / Candidate Participation / Public Matching Funds Program / 2024 Ballot (O’Farrell - Koretz – Krekorian - Price): Introduced on October 26, 2022 and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations Committee. Motion is requesting the Ethics Commission with the assistance of the Chief Legislative Analyst and the City Attorney, to report on the feasibility of allowing candidates for the LAUSD Board of Education to participate in the Public Matching Funds Program, including an analysis on the impacts to the Public Matching Campaign Funds Trust Fund and the steps necessary to place a ballot measure that would expand the eligibility of the Public Matching Funds Program to LAUSD Board of Education candidates for a ballot in 2024.

Take Action:

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Council File 22-1232, Charter Reform / Ethics Commission / Powers and Responsibilities / Ballot Measure (O’Farrell – Koretz – Krekorian – Rodriguez – Raman – Hutt - Dawson): Introduced on October 18, 2022 and referred to Rules, Elections, and Intergovernmental Relations committee. Motion is requesting the City Attorney to prepare and present the documents necessary to place before the voters on the next available ballot a measure for charter reform.
