No representatives will be permitted to speak for the applicant.

I am a proven organizational leader with 25 plus years of experience in both the government, military, and private sector. I currently serve as a career Federal Civil Servant with the US Army Corps of Engineers where I oversee our \$2.5B civil works portfolio, consisting of several largescale flood risk mitigation projects as well as numerous ecosystem restoration projects in partnership with several state agencies and local municipalities across the state of California.

Additionally, I am a register Architect in California and the President of a small residential architecture office. I hold a Master of Architecture from Harvard University where I focused extensively on housing and worked as an architect for an affordable housing firm. Furthermore, I am a retired Marine Corps Lieutenant Colonel with numerous combat deployments conducting security and stability operations in Afghanistan, Iraqi, and the Horn of Africa.

My experience and education have instilled in me a sense of duty, integrity, and desire to help the undeserved, to promote good governance, to listen empathetically to concerns, and make pragmatic decisions to support our community at large.

d) How long have you been a stakeholder in the VNC area?

My wife, son (3 yrs old), and I bought a home in Venice in June 2020 and have since given birth to our daughter (8 months old) in this community. This is the neighborhood in which we plan to raise our children.

2) Please list your previous and/or current neighborhood or community involvement.

- 3) Please list the three most pressing issues that you feel are facing the Venice Community.
  - 1. Homelessness and housing. I see these two issues as interconnected. A lack of housing and services across the state and county have overtaxed our services and support for those in the most need. We cannot solve homelessness without addressing its root causes; metal illness, addiction, affordable housing options, and gainful employment.
  - 2. Public Safety. Public safety is an essential function and right of community members. No one should feel afraid of walking our streets or calling a first responder. Public laws need to be enforced while striking a balance with providing a safety net for our most vulnerable.
  - 3. Transportation. We live in a neighborhood that will only continue to improve and become less affordable. Additionally, we live in a portion of the city that contains one of it greatest amenities. Access to the boardwalk and beach needs to be increased for all income levels and parking and transportation are essential for this, not only allow recreational opportunities but also access to well-paying jobs within our community and outside our community. Increasing access for all is what will keep Venice a diverse, vibrant and ultimately attractive community.
- 4) What do you see as the primary roles of the Venice Neighborhood Council?

I see the role of the VNC as an advocate on behalf of neighborhood residents to our City Council on issues and concerns facing our community. The VNC should provide timely feedback and impact assessments of policy decisions that the Los Angeles City council is considering, and most importantly voice the neighborhood's needs for constituent services.

5) What is your Vision for Venice?

I would love to see Venice continue and improve as a vibrant and inclusive community, that fosters creativity and the production of culture, and most importantly offers a supportive community that leads to opportunity for all; jobs, education, businesses, and investment. As I stated earlier, my children will be raised in this community. They will attend the public schools in this neighborhood, and hopefully they will want to return to this neighborhood.

6) If not selected, are you willing to participate in a VNC committee? Which committee interest you and why?

Land Use and Planning – my background in government, architecture and urban planning will facilitate this role well.

Venice Community Resiliency Committee – my current role at the US Army Corps of Engineers works primarily on flood risk mitigation so I am well suited for advice concerning community resilience in the event of emergencies/natural disasters.
