As always, we look forward to opportunities to engage or share more directly with your community—please let us know about any upcoming meetings, events, or other initiatives we can support!

The latest news from LAUSD:

- Our academic recovery efforts are ongoing, and we are working to expand access and reduce barriers to <u>free tutoring services</u> for students to receive 1-on-1 support either in-person or virtually.
- We recently launched both a <u>mentorship initiative for our most vulnerable students</u>, as well as a new program to expand access to <u>local arts and culture experiences</u>.
- To increase budget transparency for the efforts laid out in LAUSD's <u>2022-26 Strategic Plan</u>, we have also launched a new <u>Strategic Plan Budget Tracker</u> so you can see how public dollars are being allocated toward our goals.
- The Board unanimously passed my latest resolution to <u>explore new advocacy</u>, <u>divestment</u>, <u>and</u> <u>other strategies to curtail the unrelenting gun violence epidemic</u> in our country.

- Our office has spent this school year focused on campus greening efforts and community
  park partnerships, increasing early education opportunities, and ensuring our school
  communities have the resources and support they need to drive progress for all
  students. We have worked with Braddock Avenue, Stoner Avenue, Grand View Avenue,
  and Short Avenue to green and improve their campuses. We are supporting the
  Community Clean Up at Mar Vista Family Center on February 25<sup>th</sup>.
- We enjoyed visiting Venice High with Superintendent Carvalho at the beginning of the semester.
- We look forward to honoring our Venice teachers at the WAVE awards!
- We hope you will join us at the long overdue Venice High Comprehensive Modernization Ribbon Cutting Ceremony on February 22<sup>nd</sup> at 9:30 am.
