A. Motion: The VNC Board of Officers approves the October 2023 Monthly Expenditure Report (MER). (See supporting documents)

B. Motion: The Venice Board of Officers reconfirms approval of the expenditure of up to \$1000 for reusable banners, previously approved as part of the budget for the now cancelled November Town Hall on the Venice Community Plan-rescheduled for early 2024.

C. Motion: The VNC Board of Officers authorizes Communications Officer Nico Ruderman to receive the VNC digital election records from the Office of the City Clerk.

D. Council File 21-1469-S2 (Alternative Sidewalk Corrective Measures / Sidewalk Repairs)

Parking and Transportation (4-0-0)

The City's Sidewalk Repair Program is the primary means by which the City plans and conducts repairs to the City's sidewalk system. Over the past decade, much of the City's Sidewalk Repair Program has been dictated by the terms of the Willits Settlement which sets annual funding minimums for sidewalk repair work and by responding to resident complaints or trip-and-fall incidents.

The Los Angeles City Council has ordered a series of reports instructing bureaus and departments to report with recommendations to better implement the Willits Settlement, improve how the City prioritizes sidewalk repair projects, enhance sidewalk maintenance coordination with developers, property owners, and other public agencies, and ensure that accessibility improvements are incorporated into other City projects in the public right-of-way (C.F. 21-1469).

While the City is reviewing and updating sidewalk repair and maintenance policies, it is





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important that the City take action to expedite necessary repairs not imminently in the queue under the Sidewalk Repair Program. The City should deploy all available tools to improve the conditions of our sidewalks in the short- and long-term and should ensure it is making use of newer sidewalk repair methodologies which may have advantages over traditional asphalt spot repairs.

Motion: The City's sidewalks are notoriously broken, creating hazards for people in wheelchairs, on foot, and on bicycles. Despite the Willits Settlement, the City of Los Angeles is still painfully slow at repairing its sidewalks. Therefore, the Venice Neighborhood Council supports Council File 21-1469-S2 and the exploration and use of alternative sidewalk corrective measures, including diamond and precision concrete cutting, to more quickly address sidewalk repairs.

E. Transportation Management Strategies Report, Venice Coastal Zone

Parking and Transportation (4-0-0)

In November 2021, Fehr and Peers was hired by the City of Los Angeles, to analyze and make recommendations regarding the management of parking resources in the Venice Coastal Zone. See attached report in supporting documents section of the PTC page on the VNC site.

Motion: Whereas parking is a valuable resource in the Coastal Zone, proper management is essential. The PTC recommends that the Venice neighborhood Council supports the parking and transportation management strategies outlined in the November 2021 report by Fehr and Peers, prepared for the City of Los Angeles, Department of City Planning, titled 'Parking Utilization and Transportation Management Strategies Report, Venice Coastal Zone'. Furthermore, the Venice Neighborhood Council recommends that the City of Los Angeles, Department of City Planning, adopt the recommendations as part of the community plan and implementation plan update. The Venice Neighborhood Council also requests the City of Los Angeles, Department of City Planning, work closely with the Venice community during the implementation of the outlined strategies.
