
Venice Neighborhood Council (VNC) Voting Survey


A survey to provide feedback from Stakeholders on current voting methods and composition of the Board.

Results as of 1/13/2024, 11am, 81 responses.






How should the VNC elect At-Large Officers? 79 responses



If you selected that the VNC should vote for a limited number of At-Large positions, how many should it be?




What areas/neighborhoods would you suggest for representation? 50 responses




23 responses

- As to the previous question ... only the 4 executive officers (Pres, VP, Sec, Treas) should be elected
- Unfortunately the lack of participation in VNC elections means that only a very small % of people are involved and VNC inevitably gets overly politicized by some zealous advocates that are not representative of the majority of the community. Not your fault, but perhaps better outreach is necessary.
- Every neighborhood should have representation
- Suggest a ranked voting system with a minimum of 12 choices for community officers

- I think the At Large positions should total 8 or 10
- Our present system has some flaws but has the best guarantee against having one group controlling
 the elected majority of board members or even all board members. Right now it takes really convoluted
 schemes to take a controlling number of councilmembers from one group.
- My biggest concern is when there are so many applicants for the At Large positions, it's annoying to have to decide on only 1 instead of being able to vote for up to 14 that I think are qualified
- Please see above: narrowly-focused Representatives that you're describing as Special Interest Representatives.
- Persons working in Venice should not vote in VNC elections.
- Stakeholder to choose members and officers
- The number of board members is appropriate if the at-large members become more focused with special interests/assignments
- Why are the Outreach Chair and the Land Use and Planning Committee Chair the only committee chairs elected? All committee chairs should be treated the same, elected by stakeholders.
- Limit Non-profit candidates to 3 or 4
- I think officers should have term limits. Many on the council have been there for very very long.
- US Mail-In ballots to all residents
- Voting should only be open to residents of Venice with official addresses in Venice. Allowing people who may or may not work in Venice can lead to election fraud. People being paid or brought in.
- We need more access to VNC such as email addresses of members, who handles what,
- The election rules need to be enforced by DONE. They allow developers who are well connected in the City to violate them, with no consequences. Organized attacks should not be allowed.
- What is our thought on social equity cannabis stores we have none.
- Why isn't the LUPC doing it's job??
- Non-profit organizations and employees prohibited / clear conflicts of interest
- Materially expand outreach efforts so more that 2% of Venice votes.
- The VNC should represent ALL of Venice, not just the people who have the money to get all their friends and employees to become Venice stakeholders and then vote them into office.

- The neighborhood council has too many members and many of them have their own agenda, I suspect. That reduces the effectiveness of what you do. . . . or supposed to be doing.
- push for everyone to vote through advertising.
- There needs to be an action agenda for RVs/encampments, and coordinating closer with city resources to help residents with this macro issue. It's not going to solve itself.
- Restrict Stakeholders to only residents. On voting and all other aspects.
- I read the draft of your other survey and it's really bad. It's flawed in many questions that will lead to poor data. You have framed the questions in a leading way that limit the quality of the answers and most of my own answers would be way more specific. I strongly encourage you to rework this...for example, you ask people how many parking spaces should be required but this is based on the code and the lot size and zoning. Asking people to randomly vote for what they want won't provide an answer that's helpful to the community or give you an informed answer.
- A ranked voting system should have been offered as a voting option. The choices given for community
 officer are skewed toward first past the line and voting for all officers which lends itself to slates vs
 representation..
- Thank you so much for spending so much time to better our system. I appreciate the Rules and Selection Committee taking their positions seriously, putting in the time and exerting so much effort an so stakeholders can have a say!
- There are too many at large officers who do nothing. People should have specific jobs.
- The VNC is meaningless until it is granted direct legislative authority.
- Thank you for addressing these issues. I think the community has valid concerns about the current arrangement where each person gets only one vote for an At Large Representative.
- The condition & lack of maintenance of the area along Ocean Front Walk between Washington & Benice Blvd between the bike path and the sidewalk of Ocean Front Walk is disgraceful. Nothing improves, it only gets worse. Look at the County of LA parkways and areas along the beach like Manhattan Beach: why is L.A. the absolute worst at taking care of its public spaces near the ocean? Really hurts Venice. People come here and ask, "Why is this untended place so special?"
- All hearings and committee meetings should be available to stakeholders
- There should be a limit on how many developers/architects/realtor/realtor/realtor investors are on the VNC.
- We all need more access to VNC such as who handles what, we need contact info. such as email
 addresses even phone #s of VNC members, We need info of how we can get HELP to deal with
 homeless people, how to deal with Rvs How to deal with filthy streets How to deal with public toilets
 that are beyond filty and locked because homeless people are living in them, decaying public toilets at
 the end of Washington Blvd. and other locations on Venice Beach, Decaying parking kiosk at the end of
 Washington Blvd. Homeless people sleeping on the Venice Pier, What to do about streets that NEVER
 get cleaned, gas powered leaf blowers that are sooo loud and illegal but continue non-stop,
- Venice needs to get cleaned up. It's embarrassing. Many public toilets are locked and are filthy. The
 homeless problem ... we are so fed-up. RVs everywhere even at the end of the Grand Canal at
 Washington Blvd. Many streets are never cleaned. Loud gas-powered leaf blowers are illegal but
 continue non-stop.
