11. OLD BUSINESS

LUPC: PRESERVE AND CREATE NEW URBAN GREEN SPACE IN VENICE (5-0-1) Motion: The VNC recommends that the City of Los Angeles: 1. Survey and catalog current tree cover and health of green space in Venice. Using current internet maps and manual surveys to identify current tree cover and the lack of it. 2. Identify city-owned and other public land where urban forest can be introduced. For instance, many easements along Venice boulevard belonging to the city or Caltrans can be made accessible to the public, some of which already have tree cover and permeable surfaces. Many traffic islands and other left-over spaces could be unsealed and converted into green islands or connected with a continued tree-lined path. 3. Identify streets and alleys that would allow more tree planting in parkways or in medians. Coordinate with the recent Parking Study conducted in Venice to designate more streets as one-way or parking streets. Wide streets like Venice Way and other streets that used to be canals could be designated as Tree-lined Streets leading shaded pathways to the beach and around the neighborhood. 4. Identify current parks and parking lots in which urban forest cover can be increased. 5. Create an Urban Forest Management Plan for Venice that betters that of the city of Los Angeles. Set quantified urban tree canopy targets, identify resources to meet those targets, and adopt best urban forestry practices being followed by other leadership cities. 12. ARBOR COMMITTEE RENEWAL (BOARD VOTE)

Mission Statement: The Venice Arbor Committee supports and encourages the planting and maintenance of trees and understory plants, especially Southern California native species, throughout the Venice Neighborhood and surrounding communities through advocacy, education and policy work. We work with the City and their planting partners, residents, schools, developers, non-profits and other stakeholders to create, improve, and care for the tree canopy, support and improve local biodiversity, and a healthy ecosystem. We actively enlist and encourage the local citizenry to engage in planting and caring for their own yard and parkway trees and help educate individuals on how to accomplish this.

A. CERT Training (4-0-0)

MOTION: VNC Approves: Community Emergency Response Team Training

DESCRIPTION: WHEREAS: Venice vulnerable to multiple types of natural and human caused emergencies/disasters. WHEREAS: Individual and community training and preparedness are essential components of community disaster resiliency. WHEREAS: Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training provides essential emergency response skills to WHEREAS: The Venice Community Resiliency Committee (VCRC) has and continues to work with Los Angeles Fire Department CERT Coordinators to provide CERT training at venues within or immediately accessible to Venice. Therefore Be it resolved that: The Venice Neighborhood Council officially authorizes the VCRC to work with LA City to host CERT training in Venice at venues convenient



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to Venice. The VCRC will work to provide two CERT training classes the first in January 8th thru February 19th 2025 or at the first practical dates , at St. Marks Catholic Church Hall , or other suitable location and the second in May 2025 or first practical date tentatively at Oakwood Recreation Center or other suitable location. Therefore Be it further resolved: The VCRC Chair will coordinate with the VNC President and Outreach Officer to avoid event conflicts. Additionally that VNC will publicize these training events.
