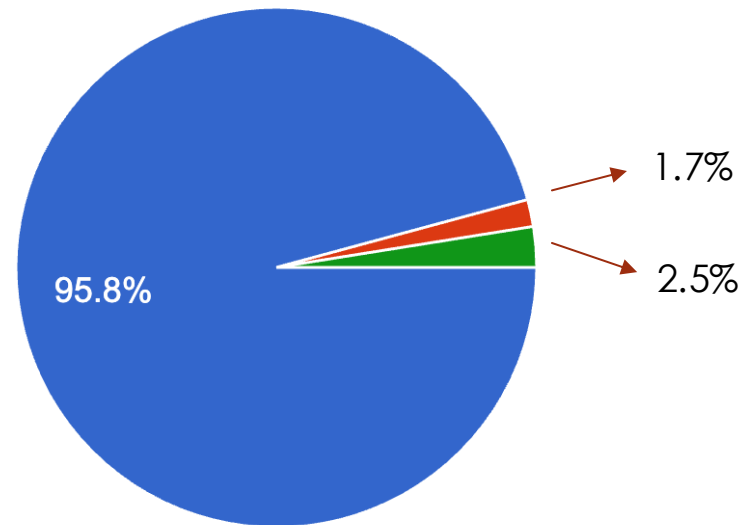

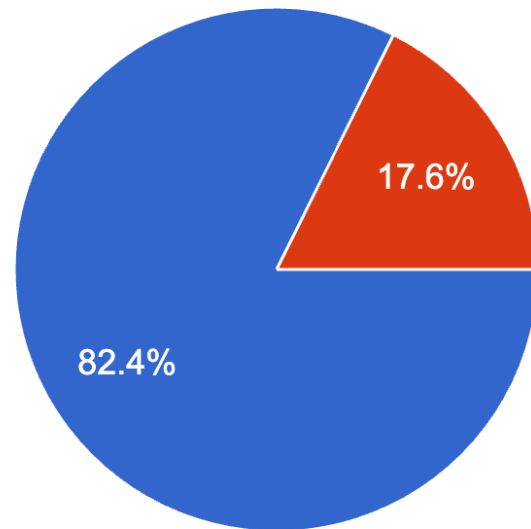

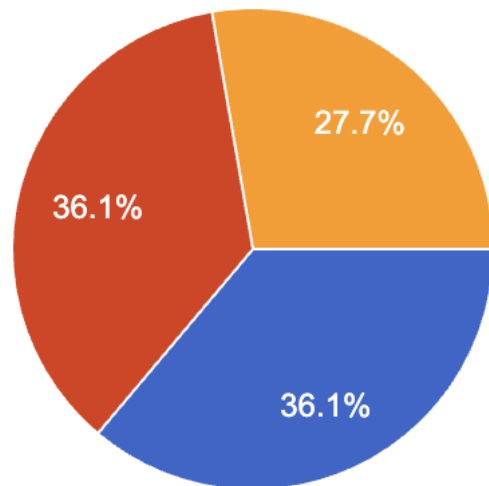

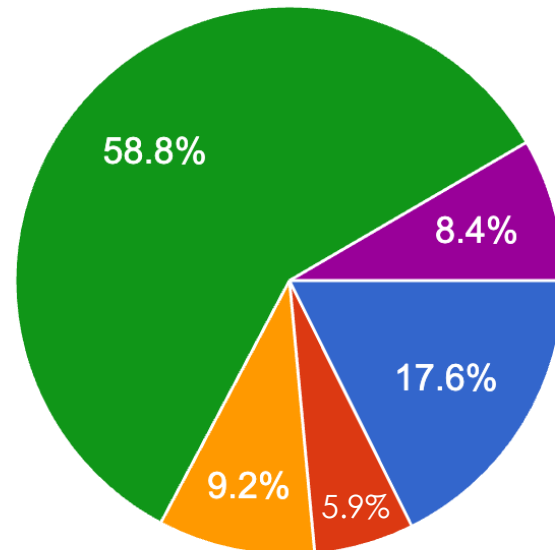

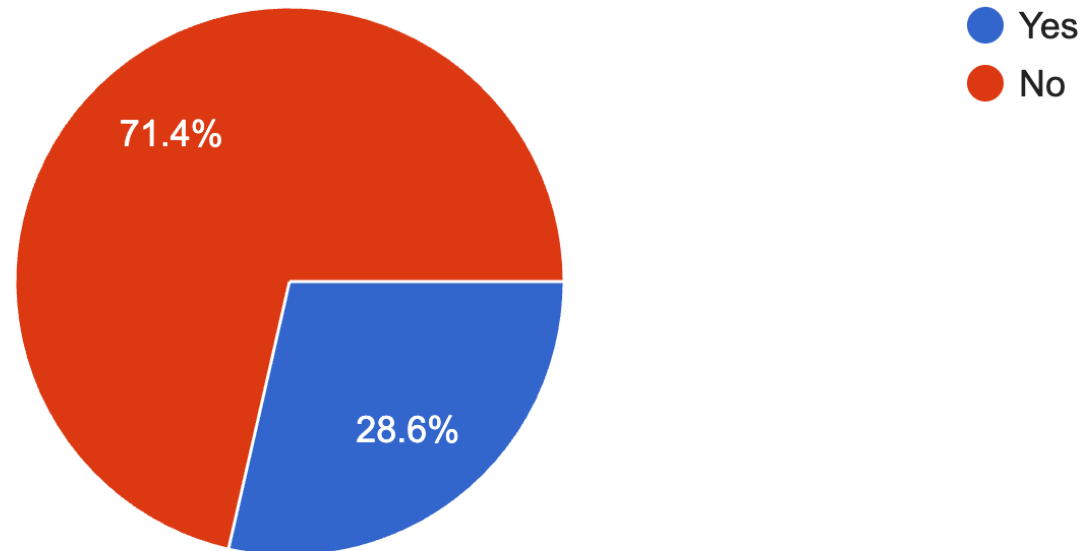


- I did not successfully complete the ballot request process

“Did not receive a response when I complained to election email address.”

“After they wrongly rejected my ballot application, I emailed an information request. They failed to reply.”

“No response from city clerk and empower LA”

“I knew I was a registered voter, but then thought I had to register AGAIN so had to call, they told me what to do ... I think I registered AGAIN. VERY CONFUSING !!! and DIFFICULT to do all of it”

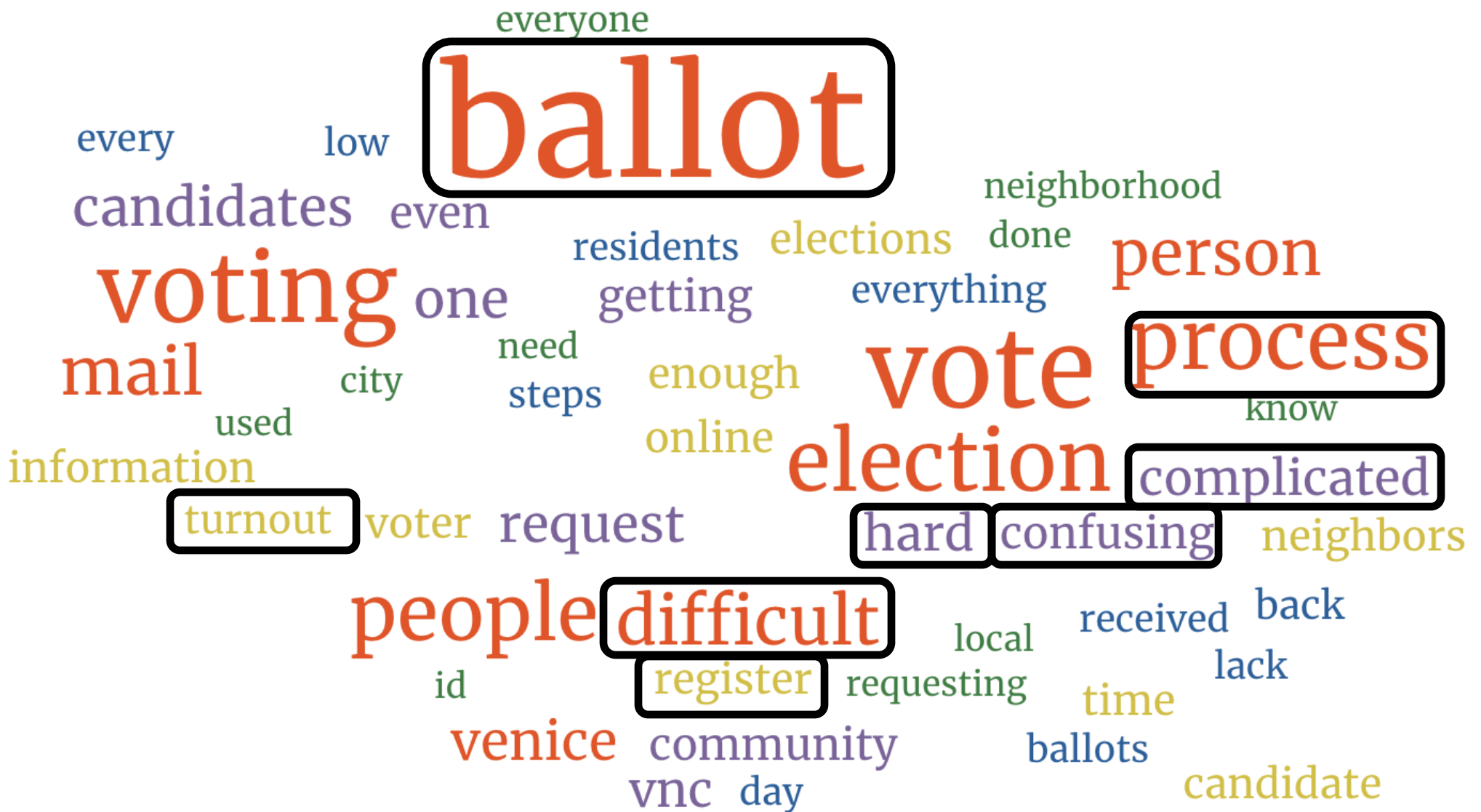
What Was Done Well?



What Was Done Well?

- “Info about the election process was available in several places.”
- “Glad that my Venice Moms group let me know about the election or else I would have missed it.”
- “Some outreach but could have been far more. Presence at Friday Farmer's Market was good to see. Why not all year?”
- “The only positive thing I can say about this election process is that I received an acknowledgment that my ballot was as received after mailing it in.”
- “Candidate forum was great/helpful”
- “Received my ballot promptly”
- “I liked the postcard notice and detailed instructions- very helpful.”
- “Information was readily available online and clearly communicated via email, newsletters, and local news sites.”
- “I liked that candidates had a meet and greet at the Venice Heritage Museum. All candidates should have as many of those at various locations before every election.”

What Was Not Done Well?



What Was Not Done Well? (city focus)

- “I think it was terrible. Too difficult for many seniors and people short on time to figure out.”
- “Because the register online process was a hassle, I submitted a paper mail-in ballot request. Did not receive a ballot.”
- “It was brain surgery! Confusing. Very disappointing!”
- “Tried everything to vote. Never got to. Huge disappointment.”
- “I spent at least an hour on three occasions trying to register but was never able to complete the process. Being forced to re-register with the City I have spent my whole life in while I am also registered with the City as a volunteer seemed absurd.”
- “My friend was running for office. And even her good friends gave up on getting the ballot.”
- “No aspect of this disaster should be repeated.”

What Was Not Done Well? (VNC focus)

- “I would like to have had a brief explanation of each person's stand on a couple big issues.”
- “Some of the people running didn't have any statement about their interest in running. Such statements should be required and should neither be too short nor overly long.”
- “Postcard was useless - VNC election website info was confusing.”
- “Too few candidates activities and the one that was held in person was more of a BONC lecture than voter candidate engagement.”
- “Lack of education of who, what, where, why of the VNC to the community as a whole.”
- “There MUST be more outreach and push to register more people to vote & participate, especially for youth. There are not enough people under the age of 40, not to mention under 30, who are involved.”

Future Election Suggestions

- “Ballots should be mailed to everyone”
- “In person voting on a Sunday like you used to plus much better process for mail in.”
- “Post signs on public property visible from both directions: SW corner of Main and Rose, median at Venice and Lincoln, median at Venice and Pacific. **Obtain permission from property owners in other key locations to post signs.**”
- “More outreach maybe at Chamber events”
- How can someone be elected with ONE vote ??? This mean they have almost no support except themselves
- “People need to learn who the VNC is and how you can help the community with specific issues and topics of concern. Raise awareness.”
- “Move election to May or June. **Start local promotion much earlier. Create a buzz around the election.**”

Future Election Suggestions

- “I never found a comprehensive overview of candidates. Ended up voting mostly for neighbors.”
- “Increase awareness about voting and have a short video introducing us to the candidates.”
- “For At-Large Community Officer I would like to vote for more than one choice”
- “Ranked Choice voting. Otherwise, lesser-known candidates won't have much of a chance.”
- “The drop off box in the library should be marked better”
- “Too little information sent out by the VNC too late. Same e-mails over and over again.”
- “Involve younger demographic. Also, if you are going to do online debates with candidates, have AI transcribe the text so that people can quickly read after the fact. Use social media more to promote VNC / elections.”
