1) Please explain why you wish to serv on LUPC.

a) Have you served before on the LUPC or on other planning and land use related committee? If so, what committee and when?

I have not served on a planning or land use committee. I hope to get the chance to serve on a planning/land use committee by working with LUPC alongside Mark Mack and the other members.

b) Please state your previous and/or current neighborhood or community involvement. Prof qualifications or relevant experience relevant

As a licensed architect with 25 years of experience, I have knowledge of many aspects of the work involved at LUPC. I have extensive experience with project submittals, including planning submittals and various exceptions/variances.

As a long-time Venice resident and homeowner of 25+ years, I have a deep passion for the neighborhood and its uniqueness. In addition, I worked in an architecture office on Abbot Kinney for 6+ years. I have a love for the neighborhood and relevant knowledge that would be useful to LUPC and the VNC. I would love to give back by serving on LUPC.

c) Please indicate your understanding of the time involved in terms of meeting and case work.

My understanding of the work required for LUPC is approximately 5 hours per month for meetings and 10 hours for case work: a total of 15 hours. Month. If more, I would be reallocating some of the volunteer time I today spend on AIA committee work to allocate correctly.

2) Please list your previous and/or current neighborhood or community involvement.

At the Abbott Kinney architecture office, for 6+ years, we frequently contributed to the community by setting up art shows and in other ways opening our doors for the neighborhood. I have served on a couple of architecture community committees through AIA, Los Angeles. I currently serve on a committee with them.

3) Please list the three most critical planning and land use issues you feel are facing the Venice community.

- a) One critical planning tools which develop and preserve Venice's unique, diverse character through design standards is of the most important issues. Efforts should work towards development in sync our neighborhood's unique multifaceted blend of cultures, pedestrian qualities, and richness of experiences.
- b) Review and contribute to the City of Los Angeles updates to the Venice Community Plan and Venice Local Coastal Plan.
- c) Land use tools to encourage new housing using Housing overlay zones and Inclusionary zoning. These should continue to be reviewed to encourage affordable and mixed-income projects. In addition, climate concerns such as flood risk in the historic Venice Canals is critical. Local development needs to be guided, with the help of land use plans, to sensible decisions taking climate risks such as flooding into consideration, especially for larger local projects.

4) Please review the Venice Coastal Zone Specific Plan and the Venice Land Use Plan(....) and comment on your opinion of each of them.

The VCZSP is an older specific plan which needs updating. It does not properly address different issues such as for instance, historic neighborhood design standards.

This Land use plan is leaving out several important issues and is issued prior the LCP.

5) My view of my role in private interactions with applicants who have projects proposes...

- a) I believe in assisting applicants in their process to submit at the same time as I believe that objectivity and professionalism. Transparency is important and I would ensure that I document and make available any information about discussions with applicants. I would follow the rules.
