MOTION IN SUPPORT OF AB 647 TO AUTHORIZE CITIES, INCLUDING THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES, TO TOW AND DESTROY BROKEN DOWN RECREATIONAL VEHICLES WITH AN APPRAISED VALUE OF LESS THAN \$4,000

WHEREAS:

(1) Broken down and unsafe recreational vehicles are parked on many Venice Streets, including Washington and Venice Blvds and Main Street. They impair the health, safety and enjoyment of the neighborhoods on and around those streets.

(2) On February 13, 2025 California passed AB 630 which authorizes Los Angeles and Alameda Counties to tow and destroy recreational vehicles, as defined by Health & Safety C. sec. 18010, parked on public streets and areas and which are valued at less than \$4,000.

(3) On June 6, 2025 the Los Angeles City Council passed a resolution supporting AB 630

(4) On February 20, 2026 a judge of the Los Angeles Superior Court in CD 11 Coalition for Civil Rights v. City of Los Angeles LASC Case. No. 26STCP00040 issued an order that AB 630 does not apply to public agencies which serve the incorporated cities of Los Angeles and Alameda Counties but only applies public agencies which serve the unincorporated areas of those counties to enforce AB 630.

(5) On January 26, 2026 the California Assembly passed AB 647 which authorizes public agencies which serve the incorporated cities within Los Angeles and Alameda Counties to tow and dispose of recreational vehicles worth less than \$4,000 after providing due process notice to the owners, lien holders and occupants of those vehicles.

(6) AB 647 is presently pending before the California Senate.

(7) The City of Los Angeles, and Venice in particular, needs AB 647 to remedy the problem of broken down and unsafe recreational vehicles on city streets.

NOW THEREFORE,

(1) The Board of the Venice Neighborhood Council requests the City to support AB 647 and urge the State of California to enact it as law

(2) The president of the Venice Neighborhood Council shall forward this Resolution to appropriate officials of the City of Los Angeles and the State of California.

That CD11 request independent, empowered oversight be established to review outcomes and ensure accountability.

That CD11 require that continued funding be tied to demonstrated results, with clear responsibility for sustained housing and stabilization.

- * Section 8 Vouchers
- * Family Vouchers
- * Disaster Vouchers
- * Emergency Housing Vouchers
