Event Mission: Regional Coordination

This Town Hall brings City decision-makers together to address the issues Venice stakeholders are facing on our streets. Our objective is to bridge the gap between policy and reality by focusing on how these issues can be more effectively addressed.

We will bring together senior-level City decision-makers to:

- **Analyze existing policies and procedures** currently in place regarding parking, sanitation, safety and housing.
- **Identify policy gaps** and roadblocks that prevent effective RV encampment resolution.
- **Establish a path forward** for clearer, more effective coordination between departments and the City and County.

Town Hall Objectives:

- **Foster Transparency:** Ensure open communication between policymakers and all Venice stakeholders, including housed and unhoused/RV dwelling residents.
- **Improve Accountability:** Engage directly with the officials responsible for creating and managing these policies and procedures.
- **Provide Clarity:** Share clear information on how community members can partner with City and County departments to achieve measurable improvements.

Event Format

To ensure a productive, transparent discussion, we are implementing the following standards:

- **Moderated Panel Discussion:** The session features a panel of senior-level City and County decision-makers, facilitated by a neutral moderator to maintain focus and decorum.
- **Community-Driven Questions:** Questions are sourced directly from Venice Stakeholders both before and during the live event.
- **Meeting Decorum:** The event will follow standard VNC meeting guidelines to foster a respectful, safe, and productive exchange for all participants.
- **Direct Engagement:** The event provides opportunities for stakeholders to learn how to work in partnership with City and County entities to address shared concerns.
