PROJECT DESCRIPTION (Include how many stakeholders will be working on this project.) (Maximum 500 words)

The Venice Canals Foundation ("VCF") is a California 501c3 non-profit corporation formed for the specific purpose of benefiting the general public by protecting, maintaining, and improving the City's historic Venice Canals and surrounding Venice neighborhoods. The VCFs' Board of Directors is composed of 11 individuals representing the diverse culture of Venice.

Our organization is seeking funds from the Venice Neighborhood Council (VNC) at this time to replace plantings and repair damage that has occurred to the landscaped public pathway known as the Venice Beach-Venice Canals Coastal Access Pathway ("the Pathway") located between 2500 Pacific Avenue and 2500 Strongs Drive, Venice, CA, for which we have previously received beautification grants and other funding from the City of Los Angeles, the California Coastal Conservancy, the Venice Neighborhood Council, as well as monetary donations from community members through the on-going fundraising efforts of the VCF, to ensure the Pathway continues to be safe and viable in perpetuity for Venice stakeholders, their pets, and the many tourists visiting our unique community. The Pathway opened officially to the public in July, 2010.

Because of its location and accessibility to the Canals and Venice Beach, the Pathway is heavily traveled, causing an inordinate amount of wear and tear on the Pathway's California coastal-native plantings and irrigation system, particularly in areas where the many dogs that also use the pathway tend to do their "business".

Our current plans include (1) purchasing heartier (and larger) California coastal-native plants to replace those that have died or are damaged beyond any hope of surviving and (2) purchasing and installing a short barrier fence for around the new plantings to protect them from damage from pets and pedestrians while the new plantings establish themselves.

Councilman Bill Rosendahl, CD 11, is a long-time supporter of this project, as are the many Venice residents and others who use the Pathway on a regular basis to access the Canals and Venice Beach. Through an official agreement the VCF negotiated with the City of Los Angeles, the Pathway is to be maintained in perpetuity by our organization. Additionally, we have hired professional landscape maintenance services to ensure the viability of the Pathway for many years to come.

From award notification to project completion, we expect the refurbishment work to take approximately 1 week to complete.

We courteously seek the assistance of the Venice Neighborhood Council through its Community Improvement Funding program to enable our organization to complete this latest aspect of our project.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT (Description of benefit to the entire community and justification for these benefits)

Venice Beach and the Venice Canals are two <u>extremely</u> popular destinations in Southern California for Venice stakeholders and tourists alike. Without a doubt, both areas experience a tremendous amount of pedestrian traffic.

Even when the Pathway was just two precarious eroding City dirt lots, residents and tourists were using them (albeit unsafely) to gain access between the beach and the canals. Because of a strong public outcry to make this informal pathway a safer access route, the Venice Canals Foundation undertook the Venice Beach-Venice Canals Access project. For the most part, the installation of the Pathway has now made that journey a safer and more enjoyable one, with the exception of the missing and damaged foliage for which we are seeking funding.

The installation of the new plantings and protective fencing will make it once again a much safer and viable access pathway for ALL Venice stakeholders and others who wish to enjoy these two unique Southern California venues.


