8A Upgraded Storm Drain Screens (soledad.ursua@venicenc.org)

MOTION: The Storm Drains west of 5th Street in Venice drain out directly onto the beach and anything entering these storm drains is not rerouted to the Hyperion treatment facility. The result is that raw, untreated, and non biodegradable sewage ends up on the beach and in the ocean creating a public health hazard for visitors to the beach and ocean. The VNC requests that the storm drains that are not connected to a pumping station be properly grated, screened and filters installed in order to prevent debris including but not limited to: face masks, needles, wipes, and diapers from entering the storm drains, blocking the storm drains and ending up on the beach and in the ocean. Furthermore, the VNC requests that "no dumping" and "no camping" be painted on the curb adjacent to these storm drains in order to reduce the trash and hazardous materials being deposited on our beach and into the ocean. 12A Housing to homeless individuals camping within 500' of Schools and within 1,000' feet radius of homeless shelter Helen Fallon (helenandbertfallon@gmail.com)

MOTION: WHEREAS, the Los Angeles City Council ("City") recently passed Motion 55A, a revision to Los Angeles Municipal code 41:18, which permits the City to restrict sitting, sleeping, lying, storing personal property, or otherwise obstructing the public right-of-way in an area designated by Council resolution that is within up to 500' foot radius of a school, and/or, within up to 1,000' foot radius of a facility opened after January 1, 2018, providing shelter, safe sleeping, safe parking, or navigation centers for persons experiencing homelessness;

WHEREAS, this regulation was aimed at maintaining a clean and safe environment for children attending school, as well as those residing in and around described facilities;

WHEREAS, projects serving the homeless in Venice which meet the description in 41:18, including A Bridge Home Sunset Pacific ("Bridge Home") and the Cadillac Hotel Roomkey program, and others, have directly or indirectly led to a massive increase in homeless encampments, blocked sidewalks, ADA violations, unsanitary public conditions, increased property and violent felony crime, as well as increased calls for service as reported by LAPD and LAFD;

WHERAS, this decline in conditions has negatively impacted the quality of life for anyone living near the Bridge Home, to the extent that residents and unhoused persons alike can no longer safely utilize the area;

THEREBY, the Venice Neighborhood Council requests of all Council Members of the City of Los Angeles and the Mayor, to immediately begin the process of offering housing to homeless individuals camping within 500' of Schools and within 1,000' feet radius of homeless shelters, and thereafter, direct LAPD and other City agencies to begin implementation and enforcement of Los Angeles Municipal Code 41:18 within all areas for which the VNC serves.
