- **12A VNC Support for concept of Bridge Housing in Venice with a Community Benefits Agreement** (Will Hawkins on behalf of the Homeless Committee) [*PRESIDENT'S NOTE: This motion is only about whether to support the concept of this program in Venice. It is not about the MTA Bus Yard*]

MOTION: Whereas there is an unprecedented homeless crisis in the City of Los Angeles; and Whereas the neighborhood of Venice has not only the highest population of homeless in District 11 but one of the most dense concentrations in the entire City of Los Angeles; and Whereas it may take months even after a homeless individual is entered into LAHSA\'s Coordinated Entry System (CES) to receive a housing voucher; and Whereas Venice stakeholders have experienced extremely negative externalities due to the presence of neighborhood encampments; and Whereas the current conditions on the streets are not sustainable for anyone, either housed and unhoused; and Whereas there needs to be real and immediate solutions to homelessness in Los Angeles; and Whereas Mayor Garcetti has proposed a temporary interim housing called the "Bridge Home" program as that immediate solution; and Whereas Bridge Home will provide temporary housing for those homeless individuals registered in CES while they wait for placement in permanent housing; and Whereas Mayor Garcetti has guaranteed millions of dollars in sanitation clean-ups for encampments in communities that support and execute Bridge Home to ensure the site of former





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encampments remain clear of future encampments; and Whereas the community of Venice should be a partner with the City in discussing how this program shall be executed to maximize effectiveness and bolster the program's success; and Whereas the Venice community should expect guarantees from the City that create a safe and healthy environment for those living in the bridge housing facility as well as those who live around it;

Now, therefore be it resolved that the VNC Board supports the concept of executing Bridge Housing in Venice for no longer than three years along with the execution of a Community Benefits Agreement (CBA) between the neighborhood of Venice and the City of Los Angeles with the following considerations:

- 1. Those in the CES system be prioritized for placement.
- 2. Only homeless from Venice be admitted.
- 3. Every six months or sooner a report is produced to outline the outcomes of individuals that have transitioned through Bridge Home.
- 4. A yearly public meeting is organized by the Mayor's office to discuss the program's effect on the neighborhood.
- 5. The City shall agree to ensure basic program elements such as
 - a) security,
 - b) sanitation,
 - c) housing placement services,
 - d) reunification,
 - e) sober coaching,
 - f) job placement services,
 - g) green space/community garden,
 - h) social enterprise, and
 - i) specific commitments from the LAPD HOPE team and a Senior Lead Officer from LAPD designated specifically for this facility.

It is further resolved, that the CBA shall contain guarantees to the stakeholders of Venice that the agreed upon conditions will be binding and ongoing through the term of the Bridge Housing's execution. *Recommended by Homeless Committee 7-0-0 on 7/30/18*

12B Line item on Board Agenda for Spanish Translation (Esteban Pulido, pulido.esteban@gmail.com) **MOTION:** The Venice Neighborhood Council shall add a regular line item as 6B to the Board agenda stating that Spanish Interpretation services and agendas are made available in Spanish.

12C Support For Changes to the Neighborhood Council System (Ivan Spiegel,

parliamentarian@venicenc. org)

MOTION: The VNC Board shall submit a Community Impact Statement IN SUPPORT of the following changes to the Neighborhood Council system:

• Recommendations and next steps for amending City Charter Article IX to change the name of the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE) to the Neighborhood Councils Department (NCD), the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners (BONC) to the Neighborhood Councils Commission (NCC), and phasing out the use of the term/branding 'EmpowerLA' due to the confusion reported by the public and the perception of Neighborhood Council members that DONE's role should be primarily to support Neighborhood Councils, which the name Neighborhood Councils Department would better reflect.





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• Recommendations and next steps for amending the Los Angeles Administrative Code to remove the "Community Impact Stakeholder," which has caused substantial confusion and disputed elections, and recommendations and next steps for including specific additional definitions by ordinance of eligible voters and board members of Neighborhood Councils, such as student or parent/guardian of a student.

• Recommendations and next steps for amending City Charter Article IX Section 901 .d and 904.f to remove any reference to "selections" and clarify that Neighborhood Council board members will be elected. Neighborhood Council "selection" processes are utilized by a limited and decreasing number of councils and are not viewed by the public as being as democratic as elections as they do not provide for a secret ballot or equitable participation.

• Recommendations and next steps for creating a one-time review process, overseen by the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners, to evaluate Neighborhood Council bylaws to determine if board seats are equitably allocated amongst stakeholder types and provide formal suggestions to Neighborhood Councils on ways to adjust board seats as needed to increase equity.

• Recommendations and next steps for adopting regulations to provide a uniform minimum voting age and board member age to allow consistent participation across the City, and what that age should be.

• Recommendations and next steps for developing and adopting a planning and land use training required for all Chairs and Vice-Chairs of Neighborhood Council planning and land use committees.
