A. Creation of Cell Tower Ad hoc Committee (5 minutes)

MOTION: The VNC Board creates an Ad hoc Cell Tower Committee with the following Mission Statement as approved by the Administrative Committee: The Ad hoc Cell Tower Committee shall review and report to the VNC Board on the placement of existing and proposed new equipment and recommend alternate solutions when feasible.

B. Jones Settlement Action (Will Hawkins for the Homeless Committee) **(45 minutes) MOTION:** Whereas: LAMC 41.18(d) is in effect stating: No person shall sit, lie or sleep in or upon any street, sidewalk or other public way, and Whereas: the Jones Settlement states 'The Los Angeles Police Department will issue a policy directive stating that it will not enforce Los Angeles Municipal Code ("LAMC") section 41.18(d) between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., and Whereas the Jones settlement does NOT in any way preclude the enforcement of LAMC section 41.18(d) between the hours of 6am and 9pm

Therefore, be it resolved that The Venice Neighborhood Council calls upon Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti, City Attorney Mike Feuer, and the Housing & Community Investment Department to update the THE JONES SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT FACT SHEET, dated November 2, 2015 and provide figures for the total number of net new Chronically Homeless units built in the Greater Los Angeles area and in the Downtown Skid Row area after October 15, 2007. If (net) new chronically homeless units have been built we ask that the Los Angeles City Attorney's office to begin the process of declaring the terms of the Jones Settlement satisfied.

Be it further resolved that the Venice Neighborhood Council calls upon Mayor Eric Garcetti, Councilman Mike Bonin, the Los Angeles City Council and Chief of Police Charlie Beck to direct The Los Angeles Police Department to begin warning anyone sitting, lying, or sleeping upon any street, sidewalk or other public way between the hours of 6am and 9pm that they are in violation of LAMC 41.18(d) and; In instances when an individual acting in violation of LAMC 41.18(d) refuses to leave the area, to cite the individual for violating LAMC 41.18(d) and if future violations occur, to secure a stay-away order to prevent that individual from continuing to violate the law.

Recommended by the Homeless Committee 7-0-0



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<u>C. Mobile Storage Program</u> (Will Hawkins for the Homeless Committee) (30 minutes)

MOTION: The Venice Neighborhood Council recommends that the City of Los Angeles and Councilman Mike Bonin create a Mobile Storage Program to serve the Venice homeless community. We recommend that it should include:

- Two customized school buses equipped with air-conditioning, bathroom, lift gates, awnings and an administrative, area.
- The school buses would be painted with murals from local artists.
- Storage program would operate Monday Friday, 7am-4pm and on Saturdays, 8am 3pm (closed Sundays and federal holidays).
- Both vehicles would operate on a fixed schedule and route, stopping at three to-be-determined locations daily.
- Staffed by two (2) caseworkers, one (1) storage attendant, one (1) driver/security guard.
- Program would create a to-be-determined amount of jobs for homeless individuals who would work to assist case-workers, organize storage areas and help keep encampment areas clean and safe.
- Program would provide 100 sixty (60) gallon containers (50 per vehicle).
- Vehicles would be parked securely each night at a to-be- determined location in Venice.
- Participants would register into a Coordinated Entry System (CES).
- Program would have a trial period on one (1) year.
- A non-profit organization would be contracted to execute the program.
