PROJECT DESCRIPTION (Include how many stakeholders will be working on this project.) (Maximum 500 words) Our proposal is to create and run a functioning Learning garden at Beethoven elementary school. The goal is to create an environment where students will discover, learn and play in a garden that is low-cost and low-maintenance designed for students, teachers and the community families in mind. Beethoven's Learning Garden would provide spaces to do the following:

- 1. Grow and harvest healthy fruits, vegetables and herbs for the school.
- 2. Outdoor space for the teachers and special programs to teach groups on science and health lessons in an open environment.
- 3. Specialized learning zones, where the students are encouraged to play and self explore aspects of nature, such as native insect, wildlife and plant species.
- 4. Open creative space allowing students to create their own projects out of naturally found materials and role-play such as archeologist, botanist, farmers, landscape designers.
- 5. Student participatory composting program that will continuously supply the garden with rich organic soil amendment as well as teach the students about the food-cycle and the importance of reducing, recycling re-using our natural resources.

Beethoven's Learning Garden will accommodate a variety of opportunities and activities. The area has locations for small group discussions such as a teacher meeting with parents. It's also designed to comfortably handle classes up to 26 students who might be there to learn about what's growing in their garden, to understand the science that comes from using the compost facilities to sustain and enhance the garden's fruit trees, vegetables and native plants or simply to hear a story read by a teacher and other students.

Part of the garden will house a native butterfly and insect sanctuary as part of its science curriculum. They will be incorporated with the planting of native Californian plants and flower species. Beethoven's Learning Garden is designed as a balanced platform for multi-purpose use. The benches serve as a seating area but also as worktables and storage for the tools necessary to tend the garden. The garden is designed to have multiple activities available for students and teachers to engage. Venice community members such as Master Gardeners and Venice High School Staff and students of the Venice High School Learning garden will be an integral part of building and maintaining the garden. Learning, exploring and playing are all activities that students, teachers, parents and visitors can do in the garden. All will be inspired, when using this multifaceted Beethoven learning garden, a unique realm designed for the greater community in mind.

Beethoven's Learning Garden echoes the Venice community's green and sustainable living priority.
Beethoven serves over 375 local area students and their families, whom many reside in the Venice community. Our school has been a leader in tree planting, natural landscaping, beautification, composting and now a learning garden. The Venice community will be welcomed to visit our neighborhood garden to see the hands-on learning our students are experiencing. A long-term goal is sharing our harvest and knowledge at a 'community school garden' booth at the Venice farmers market. Beethoven Elementary is a feeder school to Venice High School, which has a thriving Learning Garden. It is our goal for our student's education in gardening, health and environmental awareness to begin at an early age and continue and prosper though their years of education. Through this grant, Beethoven intends to provide a road map to other community schools of our achievements and to engage them in a learning garden for the health and growth of all in our community.

This preparation of this project has already begun as of Feb 01, 2011

Feburary-March 2011, Early Mornings on School days, Parent & community volunteers are clearing the site area and preparing for garden beds.

Preparation work includes site layout and planning, moving plants, moving mulch, clean up of site, layout of cardboard for garden rows, hauling and laying of compost in each row, starting of seedlings and plants to be planted.

April 2011, Beethoven School Beautification day, our seasonal school clean-up work day, the main focus of Beautification day is clean up the school campus and utilize our large work force to trim, trees, bushes, and move soil and compost.

July- August 2011, with Funds from VNC build Garden beds, Natural Wonders Exploration area, Set Stone pavers, benches and storage bin.

Parent volunteers of FOB will have scheduled workdays to complete the garden to ready for Teacher and Staff use when school starts in September 2011.

MAINTENANCE PLAN (If applicable)

The students, staff and community volunteer members will utilize the Learning Garden year round during the school year at Beethoven Elementary School. The funding for the tools, storage and benches will be critical for the proper use and maintenance of the garden.

The Beethoven Learning garden will work in conjunction with the USC Master Gardener's program, so Master Gardeners will be on site year round to help in the education of students, and maintenance of the garden site.

The Learning garden will also work with Growing Great curriculum, which has been in place at Beethoven as a seasonal partnership of garden and nutrition lessons that are designated portion of the LAUSD Life Science curriculum.







The Booster Club is also responsible for the ongoing cultivation of community partnerships with local businesses, community-based organizations, and government organizations that will contribute to and support Beethoven Street Elementary School.
