

# City Clerk – Election Division 2010 Neighborhood Council (NC) Election Procedures Stipulation Language Worksheet: Default Citywide Election Values

As the City Clerk - Election Division develops its processes and materials, we have invited all NC leaders, stakeholders, and interested parties to provide feedback. So as to provide a forum to collect this feedback, we have convened a series of meetings.

The City Clerk - Election Division held its first 2010 NC Election Development Group (EDG) Meeting this past Saturday, April 11<sup>th</sup>, 2009 at Piper Technical Center (555 Ramirez Street Space 300, Los Angeles, California 90012). The focus of this meeting was developing the default values for the 2010 NC Election Procedures Stipulation Language Worksheet.

The 2010 NC Election Procedures Stipulation Language Worksheet is the means by which a NC Board can more easily participate in the development and finalization of their 2010 Election Procedures. Using this worksheet, NC Boards will establish general voter and candidate guidelines specific to their NC election. The stipulations in this worksheet will be used by the City Clerk - Election Division to define and resolve any outstanding NC's Election Procedures.

The Citywide 2010 NC Election Procedures Stipulation Language Worksheet default values shall apply when language is not defined by an NC. The Citywide 2010 NC Election Procedures Stipulation Language Worksheet defaults will apply only to the specific issue not defined.
