The Abbot Kinney Festival is a one-day event that focuses on celebrating AND giving back to the community of Venice and its residents and businesses. It attracts a diverse attendance of more than 150,000 people, and as such, is an excellent place to showcase the best that Venice has to offer, locally, regionally, and nationally.

Having the Venice Neighborhood Council on board as a featured supporter of the festival provides visibility not only of the VNC, but of the individuals and organizations it supports and for whom it advocates. Through guaranteed marketing activities such as the in-store distribution of event guides at Whole Foods Market-Venice and the festival's strong online presence, VNC can broaden public awareness of its good works.

Following are 2010 stats that demonstrate the success of Abbot Kinney Festival "by the numbers:"

- ★ 150,000+ attendees saw Venice at its best and came from cities throughout Southern California.
- ★ 30,000+ Venice residents enjoyed the day and helped make it all happen.
- ★ 400+ booth exhibitors mostly arts & crafts, then community groups sold their wares and promoted their services.
- ★ Over 250 performers showcased their unique talents.
- ★ More than 150 volunteers helped ensure that festival attendees enjoyed the day.
- ★ About 110 Abbot Kinney merchants opened their doors and gave of their time.
- * Nearly 50 performances on four stages were presented to the public at no charge.



The Abbot Kinney Festival Association (AKFA) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that has produced an annual community festival since 1984 that showcases the vibrant and eclectic creativity of Venice and attracts nearly 150,000 people throughout Southern California each year, Proceeds from AKFA activities are reinvested into the surrounding neighborhood to improve the quality of life for youth and families, with an emphasis on the environment and the arts.

During the event, the Spirit of Venice awards are given by the Abbot Kinney Festival Association to recognize exemplary individuals, nominated by the community, for their contributions to the heart and soul of Venice. Past recipients include artists, poets, musicians, and civic leaders such as Lynn Warshafsky and Jim Hubbard of Venice Arts; artist Tibor Jankay, poet Fred Dewey of Beyond Baroque, and community advocates Betsy Goldman, Ivan Spiegel, and Diane Bush.

AKFA has produced the Abbot Kinney Festival since 1984. It is managed by a volunteer board of directors, members of whom are live, work and/or own businesses in Venice.



The Abbot Kinney Festival is an event eagerly anticipated each year by not only the community, but also by those of us in the nonprofit world and those we serve who benefit from its success. The AKFA is a vital asset to the Venice community and we are grateful for their partnership.
