# PROJECT DESCRIPTION SHEET

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PROJECT DESCRIPTION (Include how many stakeholders will be working on this project.) (Maximum 500 words)

We will transform the asphalt area between Coeur d'Alene's library and classrooms 5-7 into a beautiful reading courtyard. The courtyard will serve our students and faculty in several ways. It will provide outdoor seating areas for 20-25 people in a beautiful setting of local drought resistant plants. Several trees and umbrellas will shade the children, allowing them to read without glare or the damaging effects of the sun. Furthermore, the courtyard project intends to capture the precious rainwater which now runs into the storm drain and is wasted.

Our project benefits the highly diverse student population of Coeur d'Alene School. We have a large group of community volunteers who work with low-level readers. These benches will provide them with a quiet place to read. Our teachers will have more opportunities to expose their students to the wonders of nature and the natural habitat of California plants. The California courtyard will include numerous native plant species that attract butterflies and hummingbirds.

Whether or not the other components of the reading garden project get completed in a timely fashion, the benches and umbrellas we are requesting will still fulfill the main function of a successful reading courtyard.

The stakeholders that will be working on this project include the Junior Green Team, the Green Team, a select group of interested teachers, parent and student volunteers and the school principal, Andrew Jenkins.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT (Description of benefit to the entire community and justification for these benefits)

Coeur d'Alene Elementary is a small public school that serves the Venice community well. With approximately 500 students in grades pre-K through 5, Coeur d'Alene reflects the spirit of the Venice Community. Like Venice, the school is culturally, ethnically and economically diverse. We have been designated as a School for Advanced Studies by LAUSD, and offer enhanced programs for our students in math and science. Our school offers an extensive arts program, physical education program, and computer technology integration. Because of this, Coeur d'Alene received two major awards in the 2007-2008 school year. In the fall of 2007 our school was honored with the Music Center's BRAVO Award for excellence in arts education, and in early 2008 was named a California Distinguished School.

In spite of the high quality education provided, Coeur d'Alene lacks an environment that allows teachers and students to have an outdoor classroom for reading and studying.

We are committed to improving our school so that our neighborhood children will attend local schools; small projects like this provide huge opportunities to get parents involved in their school.



### Dear Sir or Madam:

I fully support the development of a Reading Garden on the grounds at Coeur D'Alene elementary. It is a contradiction that school campuses bear such a resemblance to industrial lots as we strive to impart early on the sustainable living concepts that their parent's generation were late to learn. The extensive black pavement at Coeur D'Alene is a blatant example. A reading garden would provide a working model of eco-friendly gardening for the students, while introducing their parents to sustainable landscaping.

I work at The Aerospace Corporation supporting development of the next generation of environmental satellites. I also serve as our company's representative to The Aerospace Academy committee, a group of local aerospace industry representatives committed to introducing at risk kids to career paths in technical fields. In that capacity, I led the development of a high school environmental curriculum and worked with local schools to implement the courses. From that experience, I have seen first hand how introducing kids in a community to environmental concepts at school plants the seeds of sustainable living within their communities.

Outside of work, I volunteer at the Coeur D'Alene school by leading a student group, The Junior Green Team in a weekly Friday lunch activity in which kids learn about the environment. The kids then deliver a corresponding "Green Tip" presentation at the following Monday morning assembly presentation of parents, staff, and students. Of all the weekly Junior Green Team activities, our recent project to fill a small planter with native California drought tolerant plants resonated most with the kids. They loved working with the soil, identifying the types of plants, and learning the attributes of each. They even experienced first hand the volume of water that could be harnessed from run off. A rain shower commenced during the planting and water immediately came streaming off the roof and gushing along side the planter where we were working. Not only were the kids fascinated to see so much water accumulate so quickly in our dry climate, they were excited to think how we might harness that water. They quickly saw the connection to our previous weeks' activities which focused on water conservation, water quality, and storm water pollution issues.

Our Junior Green Team activities are currently resource limited. The proposed grant would provide a perfect project to fully satisfy the enthusiasm and interest of these kids while providing a more natural landscape than the oppressive asphalt that has too long been the norm at our schools ening for the students, while introducing their parents to sustainable landscaping.
