 - b. Board Meeting Report: Marc
 - Curfew rules (per LAPD): Dog Walking on OFW after 12AM is prohibited and will be ticketed. The bike path is included in the curfew.

- LAPD: No noticeable increase in pedestrian traffic on Speedway since curfew enforcement started
- The media reports of county ban on ball playing and Frisbee throwing were exaggerated these were 40 year old rules the county was trying to liberalize. The new rule is that these activities will be allowed on beach if lifeguard approves.

c. Neighborhood Reports

i. Venice Beach - Central: Jessica Coakley

- Motion: made by Jessica: To request VNC Board to suggest to city that a crosswalk at Strongs Drive and Washington connecting the Canals walk path to the Wetlands nature path (North-South). Motion second by Robin. Approved unanimously
- Jessica mentioned on-line article that stated dog-walking on OFW would be banned at all times. Marc will discuss with Council Office and report back.

ii. Venice Canals: Maxine Leral

- Motion: made by Maxine: To request VNC Board to suggest to city that a crosswalk at 25th and Pacific connecting the new, handicap-friendly beach access Motion second by Robin. Approved unanimously (Note: crosswalk at 26th & Pacific could be abandoned)
- Neighborhood Watch program in canals is proceeding, led by Frankie

iii. Venice Beach-South: Robin Rudisill

- Sand berms on beach have been removed and Washington parking lot construction fences are in place
- Question: can improved lighting be included in parking lot refurbishment? Marc will discuss with VNC President Linda Lucks
- Van dropped off a group of homeless individuals around 8:30am Monday. Council office said this practice will be changed and van from shelter will drop off at Windward Circle.

iv. Silver Triangle: Bill Boyd

 Homeowners group is concerned about DWP reliability. Too many power outages, including one on Tuesday. Bill will contact VNC DWP MOU representative DeDe Audette.

v. East of Lincoln - North: Michael Stenger

- Lincoln place residents who were illegally evicted in 2006 will be returning starting around April 15th on South side of complex.
- Ocean Charter School approved for Walgrove campus has become controversial. Michael will ask Cindy Chamber from VNC Education Committee to follow up.
- Burglary problem has abated somewhat with arrest of suspects

vi. NorRo-East: Nick Hippesley-Coxe

- Over 80 vehicles stolen in northeast Venice in the last year, 50% were older model Hondas.
- Concerned with parking as result of Rose Ave. development. Marc will follow up on parking lot inventory with Councilman's office, with eye to supplement parking with private lot off-hour leases (similar to the one at Westminster Elementary).

vii. Walk Streets: Margot Michon

- Recent shooting at Barbershop near Amoroso Place. Reported to have been gang related.
- Problem with flooding her neighborhood Association is in contact with council office to seek out help on resolving flooding that happens on their alleys and walkstreets.
- Walkstreets and alleys are never cleaned. Robin and Margot will follow up with council office and report back at next meeting.
