PROJECT DESCRIPTION (Include how many stakeholders will be working on this project.) (Maximum 500 words)

We are seeking funds from the Venice Neighborhood Council under its Community Improvement Funding program to enable us to construct an ADA transition ramp on the west (ocean) side of Pacific Avenue to join the public walkway, located at approximately 2500 Pacific Avenue, with the Venice Beach-Venice Canals Coastal Access Project ("Coastal Access path) to make it a safer and more viable access pathway for Venice stakeholders and all others who wish to visit Venice Beach and the Venice Canals – two very popular destinations in Southern California for Venice stakeholders and tourists alike.

At the present time, it is virtually impossible for users of wheelchairs, baby strollers, skateboarders, and cyclists to safely cross from either side of Pacific Avenue at this location because, although the Coastal Access path includes an ADA transition ramp on the east side of Pacific Avenue, the "standard" street curb on the west (ocean) side of Pacific Avenue has no ADA transition ramp. Additionally, there are currently no crosswalk markings at this location. (Please see Page 5.A. for ground-plan showing proposed placement of ramp and crosswalk, and Page 5.B. for photographs of the current situation.)

While ADA transition ramps are normally the responsibility of the City, we have been informed the current budget shortfalls the City is experiencing precludes it from installing one at this location at the current time. Once the ADA transition ramp is installed, however, the Los Angeles City Department of Transportation (LADOT) has agreed to install crosswalk markings to allow safe passage of ALL people using the Coastal Access path.

As you will see from the attached letters of support and signatures on the Community Involvement Sheet, Councilman Bill Rosendahl, CD 11, is supportive of this project, as are the many Venice stakeholders and others who use the Coastal Access path on a regular basis. The majority of this project has already been completed through a generous grant awarded to the VCF from the California Coastal Conservancy, a Community Beautification grant awarded from the City of Los Angeles, voluntary monetary donations received from Venice stakeholders, and the on-going fundraising efforts of the VCF.

Through an official agreement we negotiated with the City of Los Angeles, the Coastal Access path is to be maintained in perpetuity by our organization which is a community non-profit corporation that was formed by a group of volunteer Venice stakeholders for the sole purpose of creating the Coastal Access path. The Community Involvement Sheet also demonstrates we have obtained volunteer labor commitments from many Venice stakeholders, with the expert guidance of professional Venice landscaper Zack Freedman, to perform the required on-going maintenance of the completed project to ensure it remains perpetually viable, safe, and accessible to all for many years to come.

We courteously seek the assistance of the Venice Neighborhood Council through its Community Improvement Funding program to enable our organization to complete this project.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT (Description of benefit to the entire community and justification for these benefits)

Venice Beach and the Venice Canals are two <u>extremely</u> popular destinations in Southern California for Venice stakeholders and tourists alike. Without a doubt, both areas experience a tremendous amount of pedestrian traffic.

Even when the Coastal Access path was just two precarious eroding City dirt lots, residents and tourists were using them (albeit unsafely) to gain access between the beach and the canals. Because of a strong public outcry to make this informal pathway a safer access route, the Venice Canals Foundation undertook the Venice Beach-Venice Canals Access project. For the most part, the installation of the Coastal Access path has now made that journey a safer and more enjoyable one, with the exception of the missing ADA transition ramp for which we are seeking funding, and the crosswalk the City will install once the ramp is in place.

The installation of the ADA transition ramp on the west (ocean) side of 2500 Pacific Avenue and the crosswalk will complete the Coastal Access path and will make it a much safer and viable access pathway for ALL Venice stakeholders and others who wish to enjoy these two unique Southern California venues.




