

JDM Perception of VNC <u>Discussion Forum Committee</u> (DFC) Challenge (Developed 6/6/2012 in a conversation with Don Novack)


<u>Current Dynamic</u>: Interacting humans/groups, depending on context, assert &/or accommodate, some more than others & with varying intensity. <u>Factionalism</u> occurs when interacting humans/groups cannot (or are reluctant to) accommodate.

<u>Position-Based-Bargaining</u> (negotiation) leads to some form of compromise depending on the skill of the participants to ask clarifying questions.




Accommodate

<u>Interest-Based-Bargaining</u> (collaboration) often leads to the discovery of common ground depending on the skill of the participants to listen & to probe underlying interests – which can often lead to identifying shared common ground (visions).

JDM Perception of Challenge Presented to DFC

My perception is that, when confronted with contentious issues, we (humans/groups – politicians/parties-factions) have learned to immediately assert hard & fast positions since past experiences have convinced us that suggestions to **Compromise** or **Collaborate** cannot be trusted.

Factionalism has become the entrenched norm in contentious issues – a cycle that feeds on itself. We avoid deliberation as a viable means of finding common ground.

In the **Venice Community** (~35,000), I believe the **Venice Neighborhood Council** (**VNC**) is well positioned to help shift the manner in which contentious issues are dealt with from:
