Whereas, the following facts about the Ballona Wetlands are indisputable:

- •more than 600 acres of land were acquired in 2003/2004 by the State of California to be preserved;
- the public, for more than 30 years, worked to protect the Ballona Wetlands;



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- more than 95% of coastal wetlands ecosystems have been destroyed;
- \$139 million was spent to acquire the Ballona Wetlands, mostly from Wildlife Conservation bond funds, and therefore, the voters' intention the purpose of conserving wildlife must be adhered to above all else;

Whereas, the Ballona Wetlands Ecological Reserve is a gem of nature on the Los Angeles coast which:

- includes habitats that are havens for birds flying to Los Angeles from as far away as Guatemala, the Amazon River, Idaho and the Arctic Circle;
- includes a rare remnant mosaic of seasonal ponds, salt pannes, wet meadows and associated adjacent upland habitats;
- includes abundant wildflowers and a high diversity of pollinators, as well as a rich diversity of native animals which are part of California's historical heritage;
- includes shelter and food for endangered and imperiled species at the Ballona Wetlands, including the Least Bell's Vireo, California Gnatcatcher, California Least Tern, Belding's Savannah Sparrow, White-tailed Kite, El Segundo Blue Butterfly and Lewis' Primrose;

Now THEREFORE, The Venice Neighborhood Council Board supports:

- community-engaged restoration of the Ballona Wetlands based on the "Seven Guiding Principles for Rejuvenation of the Ballona Ecosystem" adopted by Sierra Club, Ballona Wetlands Land Trust, Ballona Ecosystem Education Project, Ballona Institute, Grassroots Coalition and Wetlands Defense Fund; (attached)
- the "Wildlife-friendly Restoration" alternative, as outlined by Ballona Institute; (attached)
- a fully transparent and engaged public process during any environmental review for any work or future management to be planned at the Ballona Wetlands; and
- public access to the Ballona Wetlands that is sensitive to the ecosystem;

FURTHERMORE, the Venice Neighborhood Council Board objects to:

- the "holding hostage" of Ballona Wetlands public access for a plan that is highly invasive and will bring a massive construction site, including significant traffic impacts, to the Westside community for years;
- a highly mechanized, bulldozer-driven plan that would disrupt the ecosystem and harm habitat for rare and endangered species; and
- disruption of the ecosystem and the recreation area (bicycle/walking path and rowing area) of the Ballona Creek channel by removal of the earthen levees. access to the Ballona Wetlands that is sensitive to the ecosystem.
